 - Past week: average 188,110 cases/day (decrease of 21%) from average 2 weeks earlier)

Weekly Spotlight: COVID-19 in Vermont K-12 Schools

This section focuses on how K-12 schools are being impacted by COVID-19 by looking at the number of:

- people with COVID-19 who were at school while infectious
- outbreaks in schools

People with COVID-19 in School while Infectious

356 173

people with COVID-19 were on school grounds or at a school-sanctioned event while infectious. K-12 schools have had people with COVID-19 in the school or at a schoolsanctioned event while infectious.

Someone who was at school while infectious means there were opportunities for the virus to spread to others in school. Read more about the infectious period.

Outbreaks in Schools





This includes a total of 84 cases.

On average, there are $\mathbf{3}$ cases per school outbreak.

What is an outbreak in a school?

An outbreak is when there are two or more COVID-19 cases among children/students or teachers/staff with known connections in the educational setting, and the cases:

- have an illness start date or a positive test collection date within 14 days, and
- do not live together or have close contact with each other in another setting, and
- there is no other more likely source of exposure.

How much school-based transmission is occurring?

- Outbreaks indicate that transmission is occurring within schools.
- School-based transmission is occurring in a limited capacity, since outbreaks at K-12 schools are usually small.
- However, most people with COVID-19 who were at school while infectious do not spread the others while at school (83%).

17% of cases present on school grounds or at a school sanctioned event were likely a result of **transmission in schools**.

VDH Updates: Testing

Testing capacity:

- Remains very robust: thousands of slots available! (CIC on-demand; pop-ups)
 - Same-day testing slots now posted all day.
- NOTE: VDH posted testing sites are intended for asymptomatic pts.; prefer symptomatic pts. to seek connection to PCP/medical home.

□ CIC locations include:

- Bennington, Berlin, Brattleboro Mem. Hosp, Burlington, Fairlee, Hardwick, Island Pond, Middlebury, Morrisville, N. Country Hosp, Northfield, Springfield, RRMC, St. J, Stratton, Waitsfield, Waterbury, Williamstown, Williston, Winooski
- Days of the week/hours vary by site



VDH preferred protocol for obtaining COVID-19 results for patients tested at CIC on-demand or VDH pop-up sites:

- Providers should first check VITL for any testing completed through Dr. Levine's orders – this will be the most expedient and immediate way to access results. If they do not have access to VITL, and cannot gain access to VITL, then the provider may contact:
 - ahs.vdhhoccovidresultsletters@vermont.gov provide the name & DOB of their patient and the request for their results in order to help treat that patient.
- Many thanks to those who responded to our brief survey (1/15/21) which confirmed that many Vermont PCPs do not have access nor regularly use VITL, which adds a layer of complexity and administrative burden to office systems already stretched thin in the current context.

VDH Call with Commissioner Levine (1/21/21)

[Selected remarks/questions]

- Have not seen significant post-holiday case surge
 - Outbreak assoc. with Victory Baptist Church at 130 cases
- □ No known cases associated with bus to DC (1/6/21)
- □ Starting to watch data from returning college/univ. students
- May be "idealistic" to think all schools will be fully in person by spring
- Recent CDC guidance advises "cannot discriminate re: giving vaccine (e.g., if requested by out-of-state resident) – still processing.









Governor Phil Scott (a different look today!)

- Quarantining (also: Levine, Smith, Schirling, Pieciak)
 - Close contacts of "contractor" at media briefing, 1/19/21
- Governor has tested negative once; will test again on day 7 (last exposure was Tuesday, 1/19/21)
- Today: describe Phase 2 vaccine rollout: 75+ yo (next week)
- □ Science clear; if more doses, could vaccinate broader group
- Prioritize saving lives; believe this will get us out of State of Emergency faster
- We want all to be vaccinated: if more supply available, will scale up quickly







AHS Secretary Mike Smith:

- Phase 2: first age band <u>only</u> 75+ yo; then move to 70+, then 65+, then people with certain conditions.
- "Moral obligation to take age-based approach first"
- When registration opens Monday (1/25/21), "will be enough slots for all in first age group to obtain appointment."
- □ Everyone must have patience:
 - Appointment may not be immediate or day you would prefer but <u>will</u> be w/in designated 5-week period for this age group.
 - When you make an appointment, please keep it avoid delaying vaccine for others & vaccine wastage.







AHS Secretary Mike Smith:

- □ 54 sites in 39 towns details will be final Monday, 1/25/21.
- From 1/27 3/2, appointments available in PODs, pharmacies, health care partner sites.
- Registration begins 1/25; appts. begin 1/27 please register at site close to your home; sites are based on regional population in age grps.
- □ Will release web site & phone number on Monday morning.
 - Available on VDH web site, social media, news releases.
- Please go online to register if able; call-in option w/~400 operators.
 Don't call anywhere else! VDH web site: materials, video, FAQs, tips

- At registration: name, DOB, address, phone, email if available
- □ Verify residency in Vermont.

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- □ If not 75+ yo, do not register.
 - If spouse/partner also 75+ yo, each must register separately
- Series of health questions impt. for vaccination process.
- □ Insurance info if avail. but not required for registration.
- Select vaccine clinic site nearest to home and date/time from menu of options.

Will receive verification letter sent to email. VERMONT





AHS Secretary Mike Smith – what to expect at sites:

- □ Upon arrival: provide name & DOB; sign consent
- Vaccine administered
- □ Remain at site for ~15 minutes (30 mins. if h/o certain allergies)
- □ 2nd/follow-up appt. will be scheduled before leaving.
- Cannot accommodate walk-ins.
- □ Equity team working w/key partners to support BIPOC populations.
- □ Separate logistics (EMS, HHA) for homebound.
- □ "Please respect the rules"







VDH Commissioner Levine

- Case counts continue to fluctuate. Recent average only 10% cases associated w/outbreaks; >50% had contact w/known case; only 1 in 4 have unknown source of exposure
- □ Outbreaks w/o as great impact as in Oct.
- □ 52 outbreaks: 21 in LTCFs/senior living; 19 workplaces; 5 in schools.
- □ Of 6 more deaths, all older Vermonters half in LTCFs, half at home/hosp.
- Watching returning college students data; already impacting student athletes.
- Vaccine uptake in Group 1a: Bi-State/FQHCs, 70-92% HC staff received vaccine. Surveys of hospitals/calls w/CEOs indicate similar rates (only 1 65%; several 90-92%). LTCFs: "astounding" 92% of residents; staff at 60%.







VDH Commissioner Levine: "My Quarantine Experience"

- Thank-you for well wishes I'm doing what we've asked every Vermonter to do when potentially exposed
- □ Our exposure clearly fit definition worthy of quarantine.
- VDH MMWR publication (re: VT Corrections experience: informed CDC guidance revision to incorporate cumulative exposure into the equation)
- I had opportunity to d/w very patient/professional contact tracer & received great/practical guidance, responses to all questions, reference materials.
- □ Had to rethink daily patterns of life; mask-wearing at home to limit exposure
- Continuity of State of Vermont business: all working remotely effectively
- Can't wait to test VDH trend-setting alteration: test out of quar d. 7 if well.



Friday Media Briefing: Q & A

□ When even the media support people have "technical difficulties":

- Q & A moderator Rebecca] taking questions by text, "even though you might prefer to do the grilling yourselves..."
- □ Teacher petition re: requesting defined position in vaccine queue
- Governor Scott: not enough vaccine at this point moral obligation to care for those who have cared for us.
- □ Other Governors "have overpromised"
