Elizabeth H. Bradley, PhD, MBA, Brady-Johnson Professor of Grand Strategy and Professor of Public Health and Faculty Director of the Yale Global Health Leadership Institute, is renowned internationally for her work on health system design and large-scale implementation of efforts to improve management capacity in health care delivery within the U.S. and abroad. Dr. Bradley has several health extems strengthening projects in Improve management capacity in freatin care delivery within the U.S. and abroad Dr. Bradley has several health system strengthening projects in itermational settings, including China, Ethiopia, Liberia, Rwanda, South Africa, and the United Kingdom. Dr. Bradley is the principle investigator for Yale on the Rwanda Human Resources for Health Program, which was recognized by President Bill Clinton and the Clinton Global Initiative during their annual meeting in 2012. She was the recipient of a Bill & Mellinda Gates Poundation grant to develop a novel framework of diffusion, dissemination, and widespread upake of health innovations, and she leads the Yale African Wilson, State of the Company of the Company

Peter D. Donnelly, MD, MB, ChB, MPH, MBA, FRCP, FRCPE, FFPH is the President and CEO of Public Health Ontario, a government agency dedicated to improving population health, reducing inequalities, and working to keep the province safe from public health threats. With a career in public health spanning 25 years, Dr. Donnelly has held a series of increasingly senior academic and leadership positions in Wales, Scotland, and now Canada. As Professor of Public Health Medicine at the University of St Andrews, he led research on violence reduction, and as Deputy Chief Medical Officer to the Scotlish Government, he provided senior leadership at the national level. His experience includes planning for emergency preparedness, as well as a range of health promotion initiatives in areas such as tobacco control, alcohol policy, and sexual health. Dr. Donnelly is an active researcher and lecturer and is the co-editor of the recently published Oxford Textbook of Violence Prevention.

Bruce Goldberg, MD has devoted his professional career to improving population health and the organization, delivery, and financing of health and human services. He served two Oregon Governors, first as the Director of the Oregon Department of Human Services from November 2005 through February 2011 followed by leading the formation of the Oregon Health Authority from February 2011 through 2013. Dr. Goldberg led Oregon's nationally recognized health reforms, transforming Oregon's Medicaid system to one based on a model of health and coordinated care. In addition he led efforts to establish Oregon's Healthy Kids program, which provides health coverage for all children, to improve Oregon's mental health system, and to transform the delivery of public human services to enhance efficiency and effectiveness. Dr. Goldberg continues to focus on health reform and health delivery system change. He has published widely and consulted with organizations across the country.

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Claire Oatway, MBA, FRSA is the Chief Operating Officer of Beacon Medical Group in Plymouth, United Kingdom. Beacon Medical Group is a merged practice formed in April 2015 that supports 33,000 people across Plymouth and South Devon. Claire focuses on building a sustainable practice that thrives on innovation and views patients, staff, partners, and communities as one team. Plymouth's Beacon Medical Group is the largest local general practitioner training provider with a heavy slant towards research to improve patient care. A series of collaborations with national and local businesses drives the development of innovative services and products that help keep patients and staff healthy.

Erika Rogan, MSc is a PhD candidate in Health Policy and Management at Yale University. Her dissertation research focuses on how states leverage social services to improve the health of populations, particularly older adults. Previously, Erika conducted program evaluations as a health care consultant with a variety of government agencies, including the Food and Drug Administration, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, and the Department of Defense.
