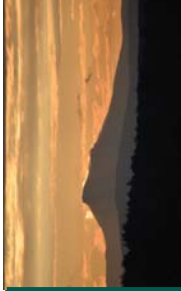
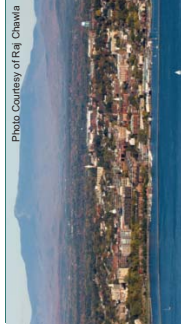

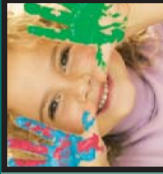

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is the tenth meeting of this highly acclaimed conference which previous attendees have praised for its quality and usefulness. This year's conference will feature lectures on a broad variety of topics from a clinical and public health perspective.

AUDIENCE

Pediatricians, Family Medicine Physicians, Nurses and Other Primary Care Providers, Mental Health Professionals, Educators, and Social Workers.

OBJECTIVES

The objective of this conference is to equip primary care clinicians and other professionals with updated knowledge on issues related to child mental health and to provide practical and updated strategies for the assessment and treatment of many of the most common childhood psychiatric conditions and problems. Specific topics to be addressed at this year's conference include temper tantrums, non-pharmacological treatment of ADHD, gender non-conformity and tics, among others.

Emphasis will focus on incorporating strategies within the practical confines of a busy outpatient setting. Treatment options, both pharmacological and non-pharmacological, will be presented. There will also be opportunities for small group discussion of your specific clinical questions.

At the end of the conference, participants should be able to:

1. Describe the boundaries between typical and atypical temper tantrums in young children.
2. Define three non-pharmacological treatments for ADHD.
3. Describe some of the health risks associated with cannabis use.
4. Describe strategies for suicide and child abuse prevention.
