This year, Transforming Primary Care will provide strategies for prioritizing and measuring behavioral integration into medicine. Leadership in the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA), OneCare, and Community Physicians and Behavioral Health practitioners involved in integration activities will discuss specific strategies to help your practice improve medical care, moving Vermont healthcare forward clinically and financially.

Participants will review practice assessment, recognize facilitators and barriers to integration, consider the need for a Vermont interprofessional training model for those in practice and in Vermont academic institutions. An optional workshop day will facilitate practice-specific integration improvement strategies using the Behavioral Health Integration Toolkit. Join us!

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Identify 3 emerging areas of importance for behavioral health elements as part of regulatory and financial elements of healthcare reform.
- List the elements of an integrated model of medication assisted treatment of narcotics dependence.
- Discuss the range of personnel needed for training in team-based care.

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OPTIONAL TWO-PART WORKSHOP: Staying Ahead of Integration: It's the Process Not the Provider

Workshop Description

The goal of behavioral health integration in primary care is the seamless delivery of medical, behavioral, mental health and substance misuse care with well-functioning clinical, operational and financial processes that produce Triple Aim outcomes. Significant planning, design and implementation efforts are needed to integrate these primary care services. Integration efforts (sometimes called Collaborative Care) have lacked such initial and ongoing attention.

This workshop is offered to primary practice teams who want to define their current state of integration and lay out the steps to integration as identified in the Behavioral Health Integration Toolkit. The outcome of this workshop will be a detailed plan to support an integration project within the practice. Attendees may opt to attend only workshop Part One or attend both Part One and Part Two. (Please note: you must attend Part One in order to attend Part Two.)

Rodger Kessler, PhD, ABPP, Connie van Egghen DrPH, Sarah Scholle, DrPH, MPH, Dale Stafford MD and Candace Collins, MS-MHIT will lead practice teams consisting of at least one primary care provider, at least one clinical staff member of the practice (nurse or rooming staff), and a behavioral health clinician who is working, or plans to work, in the practice. Other practice members can be included as appropriate. Team members can expect to work through the initial steps in the toolkit to tailor a plan to implement in their practice setting. In addition to planning, we will discuss the potential for ongoing consultation.
