



Health Equity Student Internship Stipend Program

WHAT IS THE HEALTH EQUITY STUDENT INTERNSHIP STIPEND PROGRAM?

The Health Equity Student Internship Stipend Program allows public health students to gain practical experience working on projects to improve health equity at agencies providing public health or primary health care services. The program is funded through the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) New England Public Health Training Center (NEPHTC). A total of 4 internships will be funded annually in Vermont.

WHAT IS THE FINANCIAL AWARD?

Students will receive a \$3,500 stipend upon completion of their internship and submission of a final report and presentation to HRSA. Student should have a total of 200 hours of work.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Priority is given to master's or doctoral students in public health. Graduate students in other health professions and 3rd and 4th year undergraduate students in public health may also apply. Students must be a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national with a visa [permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

WHAT IS THE TIMEFRAME?

For 2018/19 placements are available during the academic year for either semester with a completion date of June 30, 2019.
