# VDH Weekly Data Summary: Symptom Onset to PH Response

- 10-19 & 20-29 yo pts. (& HCWs) tested more quickly after symptoms than general pop.
  - ▣ “Why” unknown: adults more likely to dismiss symptoms? Concern to get kids back to school?
- Pediatricians/family physicians doing a great job – thank you for your role in testing!
- However, some cases noted where pediatric patients sent home from school; alternate dx assigned at medical home w/o testing.
- ***Please continue to reinforce importance of (timely) testing!***

Teens and people in their 20s are **tested sooner** after starting to feel sick. People in their 50s and 60s are **tested later** after starting to feel sick.



\*The Health Department has symptom onset information in 68% (8,558 of 12,503) COVID-19 cases.

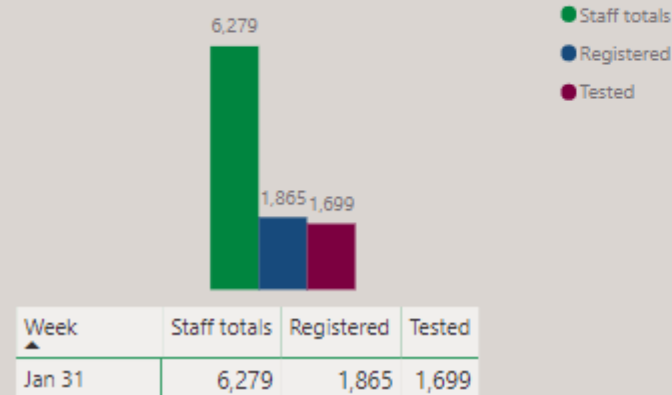

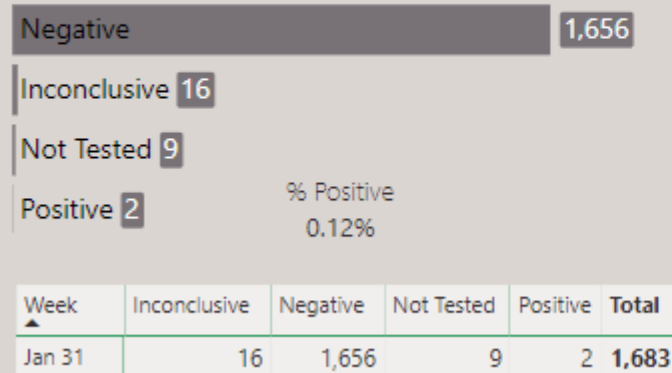

## COVID-19 Vaccination Scheduling at Kinney Drugs in Vermont

Currently, the State of Vermont allows Kinney Drugs Pharmacists to administer COVID-19 vaccines to Vermont residents age 75+ BY ONLINE APPOINTMENT ONLY. You do NOT need to preregister on the Vermont Department of Health website to schedule an appointment at Kinney Drugs.

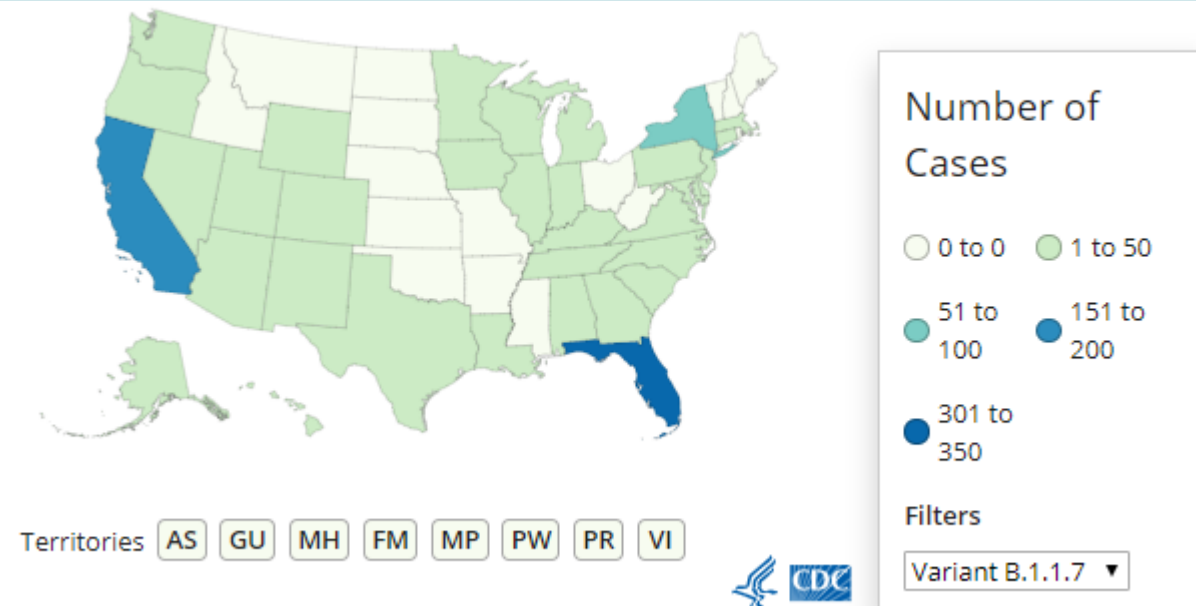

# From the CDC: Recent MMWRs



- ❑ COVID-19 Vaccination Intent, Perceptions, and Reasons for Not Vaccinating Among Groups Prioritized for Early Vaccination — U.S., Sept. & Dec. 2020  
(*Early Release 2/9/21*)
- ❑ Intent to receive COVID-19 vax incr. from 39.4%-49.1% among adults & across all priority groups; nonintent decr. from 38.1%-32.1%. Despite decreases in nonintent from Sept.-Dec., **younger adults**, women, non-Hispanic Black adults, adults in nonmetropolitan areas, & adults w/less educ./income & w/o health ins. have est. nonintent to receive COVID-19 vax.
- ❑ Maximizing Fit for Cloth and Medical Procedure Masks to Improve Performance and Reduce SARS-CoV-2 Transmission and Exposure, 2021  
(*Early Release 2/10/21*)
  - ❑ CDC conducted expts. to assess 2 ways to improve fit of med. proc. masks: fit cloth mask over med. proc. mask, & knotting ear loops of med. proc. mask/tucking in/flattening extra material close to face. Each substantially improved source control/reduced wearer exp.
- ❑ Coming soon: variants; updated school guidance.

# VDH Updates/Topics Under Discussion

- ❑ Schools/whether to reconvene Strong & Healthy Start Task Force
- ❑ COVID-19 impact on social-emotional health of children and youth
- ❑ COVID-19 vaccine & patients w/developmental & intellectual disabilities
- ❑ HAN: **Updated (2020) Treatment Guidelines for Gonococcal Infections (2/8/21)** – New commendations:
  - ❑ Treat gonorrhea infections with a **single 500 mg injection of ceftriaxone**.
  - ❑ A test-of-cure is not needed for people who receive a diagnosis of uncomplicated urogenital or rectal gonorrhea unless symptoms persist.
  - ❑ A test-of-cure is recommended in people with pharyngeal gonorrhea 7-14 days after the initial treatment, regardless of the regimen.
  - ❑ Patients who have been treated for gonorrhea should be retested three months after treatment to ensure there is no reinfection.
- ❑ As always, facilitate partner testing and treatment.

# VT Schools in the News

- Leland and Gray (Townshend): grades 6-12 had been fully remote since March
  - ▣ Recent AOE data for VT schools: ~1/3 in-person, 48% IP part-time; 19% remain fully remote.
- 6<sup>th</sup> grade back 4d./wk; 7-12 split into 2 groups and alternate days.
- Used CARES act funding to address air filtration issues; gym, music room & cafeteria remain off-limits.

- ❑ Feb. 12: resume interscholastic/youth competition for basketball, hockey, indoor soccer, futsal, broomball, volleyball.
- ❑ Individ. sports/low-no contact: bowling, dance, gymnastics – virtual.
- ❑ Close proximity sports: no more than 2 games/7d. & minimum 3d. between games. No spectators at indoor events – only key personnel.
- ❑ RTP after illness
- ❑ Mask mandate extended to officials of indoor sports events; electronic, handheld whistle or whistle mask/gaiter at all times.

# Tuesday Media Briefing (2/9/21)



AHS Secretary Mike Smith [Gov. Scott on NGA/WH call]

- ❑ Ltd. new info re: federal pharm program w/Walgreen's. Awaiting details re: what Walgreen's will receive & when appts. available.
  - ▣ Will add link to VDH web site.
  - ▣ Expect ~20 Walgreen's across VT to participate; 4 in southern VT.
- ❑ As of today: 32% in 75+ vaccinated, homebound under way.
- ❑ Reports of vax to those "not elig."; intervened where appropriate.
- ❑ Making substantial progress in phase 2 – helps w/primary goal.
- ❑ May still create acct. if not yet eligible: on line or by phone. "Will move to another age group soon."
- ❑ SOV will offer COVID-special enrollment QHP **2/16 – 5/14/21** for uninsured & non-Medicaid eligible.

# Tuesday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



## VDH Commissioner Levine

- ❑ Expanding testing in Benn. Co.; past week slight downturn in cases, although remains well above state av. (also hosps.)
- ❑ Grateful to town of Manchester for standing up new sites. Also daily testing at SVMC & CIC sites.
- ❑ Rutland & Franklin Cos. also now w/cases increasing
- ❑ “Go on offense”: keep guard up & seek avail. testing
- ❑ Rutland: daily testing at RPMC; Franklin Co. mult. test sites.
- ❑ “Steady pattern of cases in VT at odds w/declining across the region.”

# Tuesday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



- New vaccine efforts in communities where 1<sup>st</sup> lang not English.
  - ▣ Work w/cx brokers, have interpreters on hand; provide accurately translate materials in partnership w/AALV, USCRI, LEND UVM MC, AgeWell, others.
- Two more clinics planned this week. Language barriers led to outbreaks & disproportionate outcomes – proud that we took steps quickly to prioritize.
- Secy. Smith & I have been clear/candid to appropriately prioritize our BIPOC & English language-learning; have spoken of linguistic, communication, educational needs. Discussed those 75+ living in multi-gen households, v. strong risk factor for COVID transmission.
- Made sense to allow household members to get info/services at same time. Much more to do to address signif. disparities in cases/hosps./deaths in communities of color; hope vaccine effort this is impt. step to reach historically underserved people in VT.

# Tuesday Media Briefing (2/9/21)



## Governor Phil Scott

- Just off phone w/other governors (NGA) & WH officials; all Governors were on the call – received good/positive news
- Feds will distribute extra ½ m. doses over next 3 wks. – about 500 more doses for VT. Complicating factor: made mention they will start counting the 6<sup>th</sup> dose of Pfizer – hadn't accounted for prev. May skew by ~50 doses. Having 3-wk. supply key for our planning.
- Feds also launch new program for CHCs/FQHCs: contract directly. 250K doses total to them starting next week – build up to 1.m Complication: counting 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> dose w/in 1m. Right now we don't account for that. Could be 250 doses for FQHCs in VT.
- Discussed new 2<sup>nd</sup> dose protocols – up to 42d.

- Families spend no more than 10% of their income on child care.
- All children are taught by early childhood educators who are fairly compensated, respected professionals.
- Vermont has a well-coordinated child care system with transparent decision-making and modern IT to support equitable outcomes for our children.
- There is stable, long-term funding for our child care system.

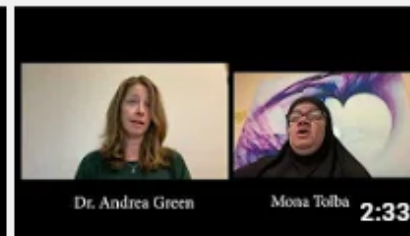
