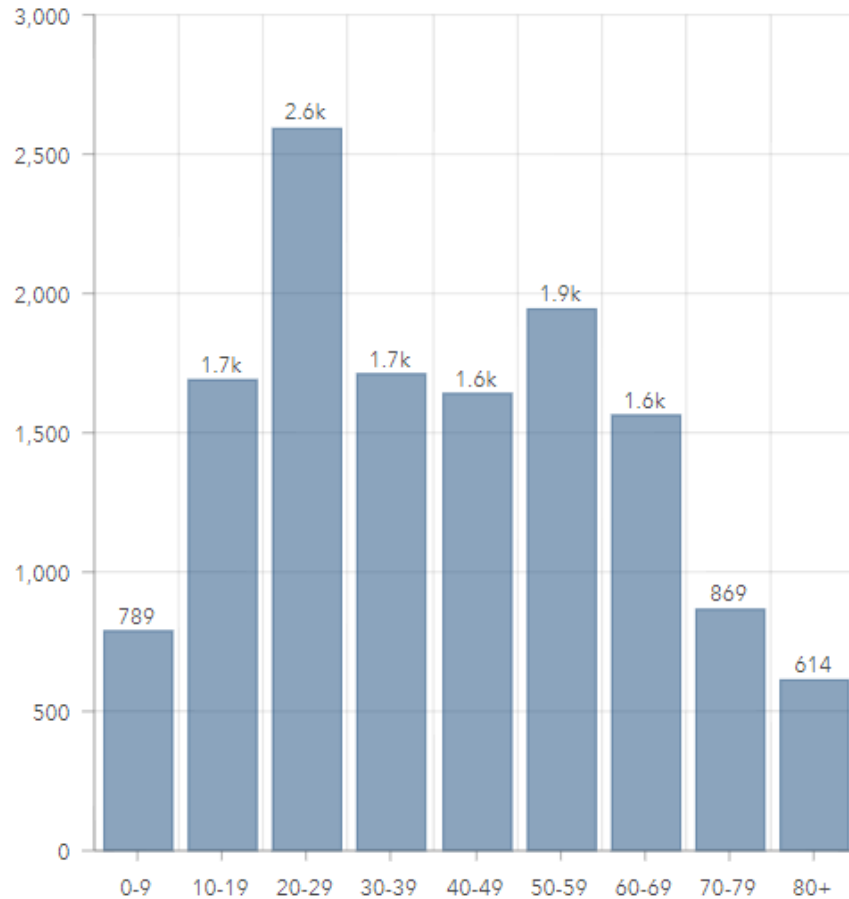

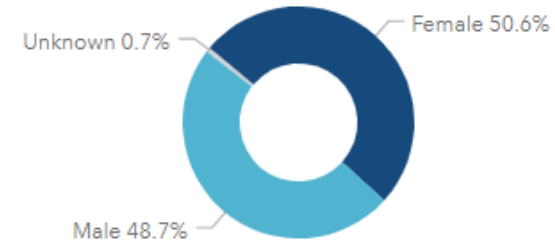

Vermont COVID-19 Cases by Age Group

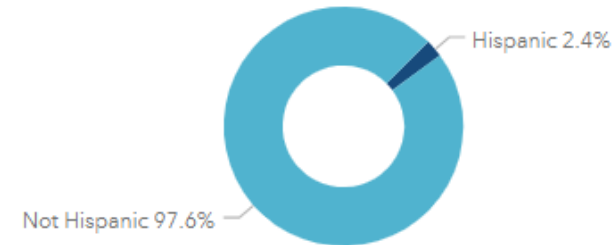


Case Demographics

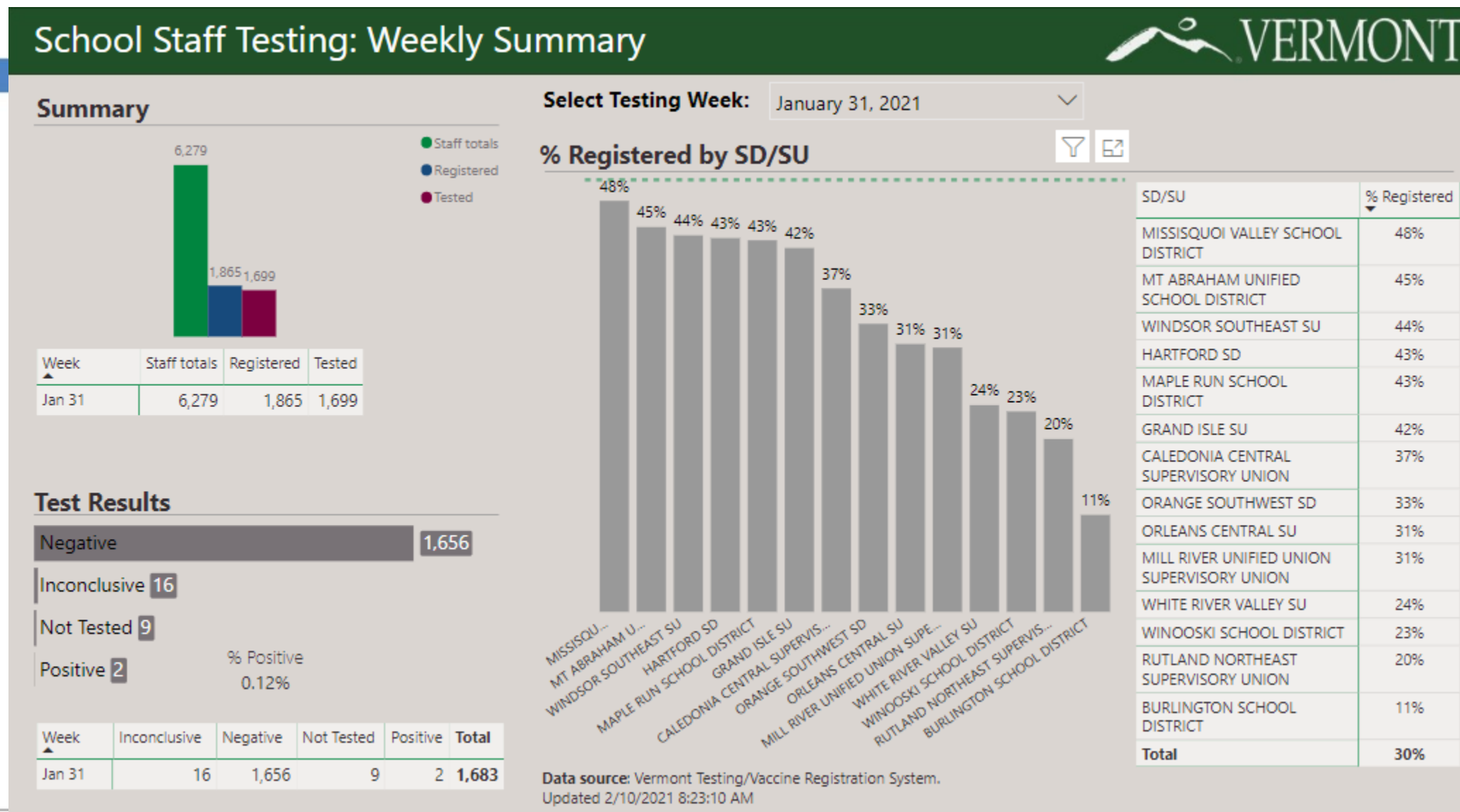

AOE School Staff Testing Dashboard

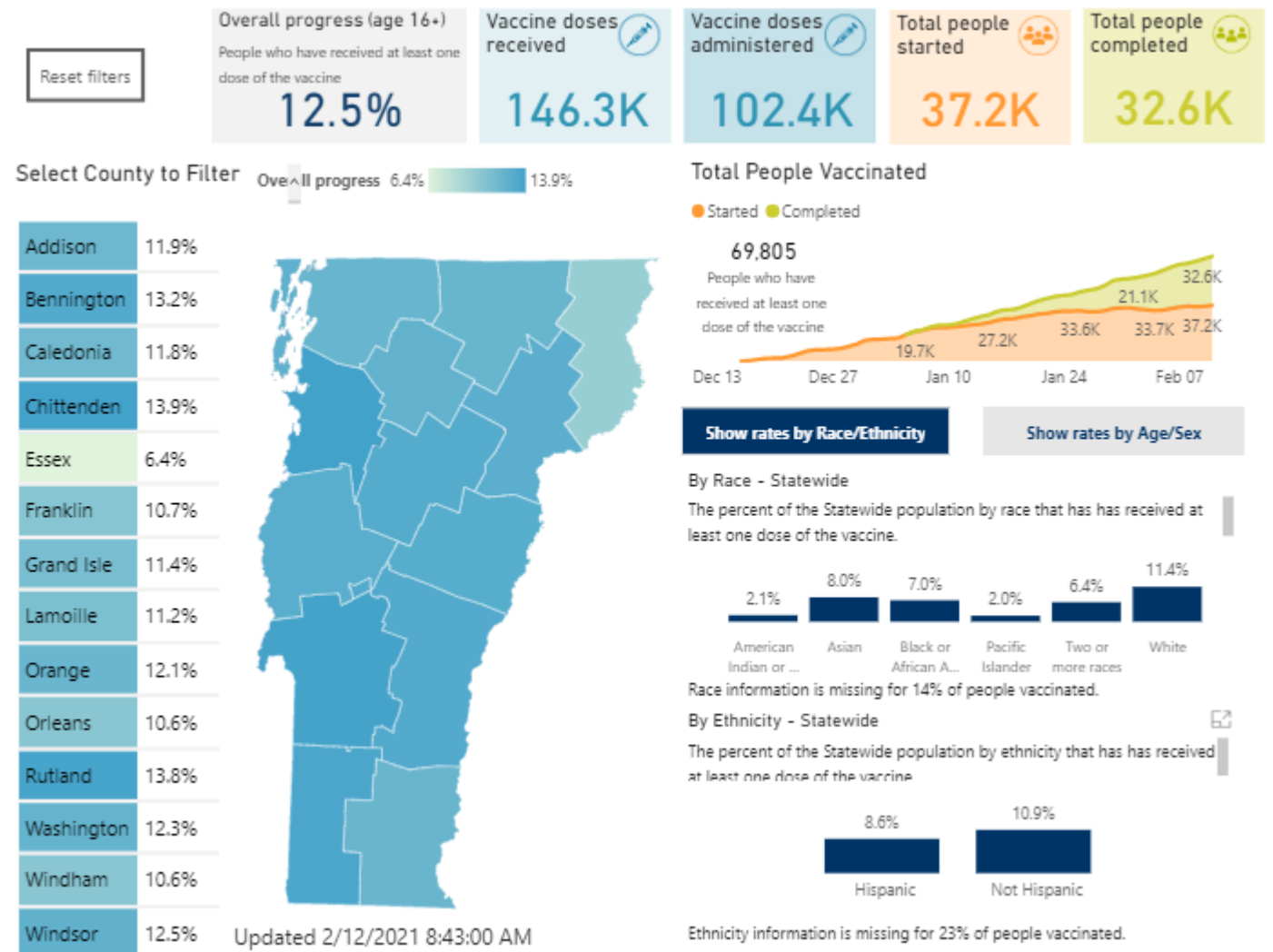

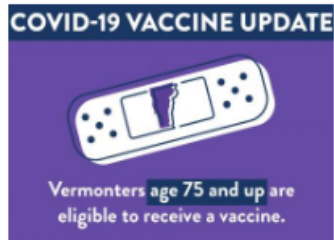

There are enough appointments for everyone who is eligible. Appointments are required. Clinics can't accept walk-ins.

To make an appointment online with the Health Department:

1. [Create an account](#) (anyone can do this anytime!)

You may already have an account if you were tested for COVID-19 at a Health Department site.

2. [Make an appointment](#) when your age group is eligible to get the vaccine.

- We can help with appointments with the Health Department or Kinney Drugs.

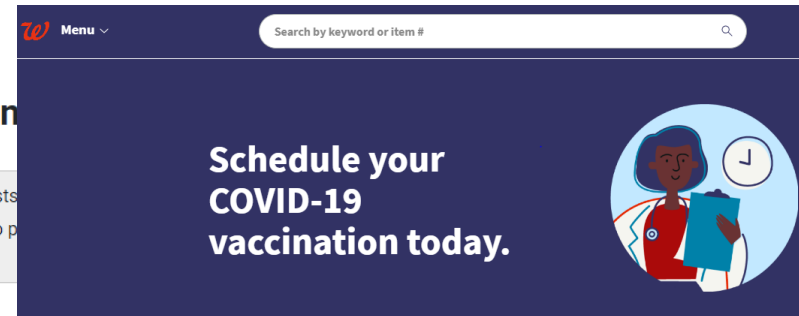

COVID-19 Vaccination Scheduling

Currently, the State of Vermont allows Kinney Drugs Pharmacists age 75+ BY ONLINE APPOINTMENT ONLY. You do NOT need to pre-schedule an appointment at Kinney Drugs.



February 12, 2021

Limited supplies of COVID-19 vaccines are now available in some states at select stores to individuals 16 years of age and older (16 years of age and older for Pfizer; 18 years of age and older for Moderna) who meet state-specific eligibility criteria.

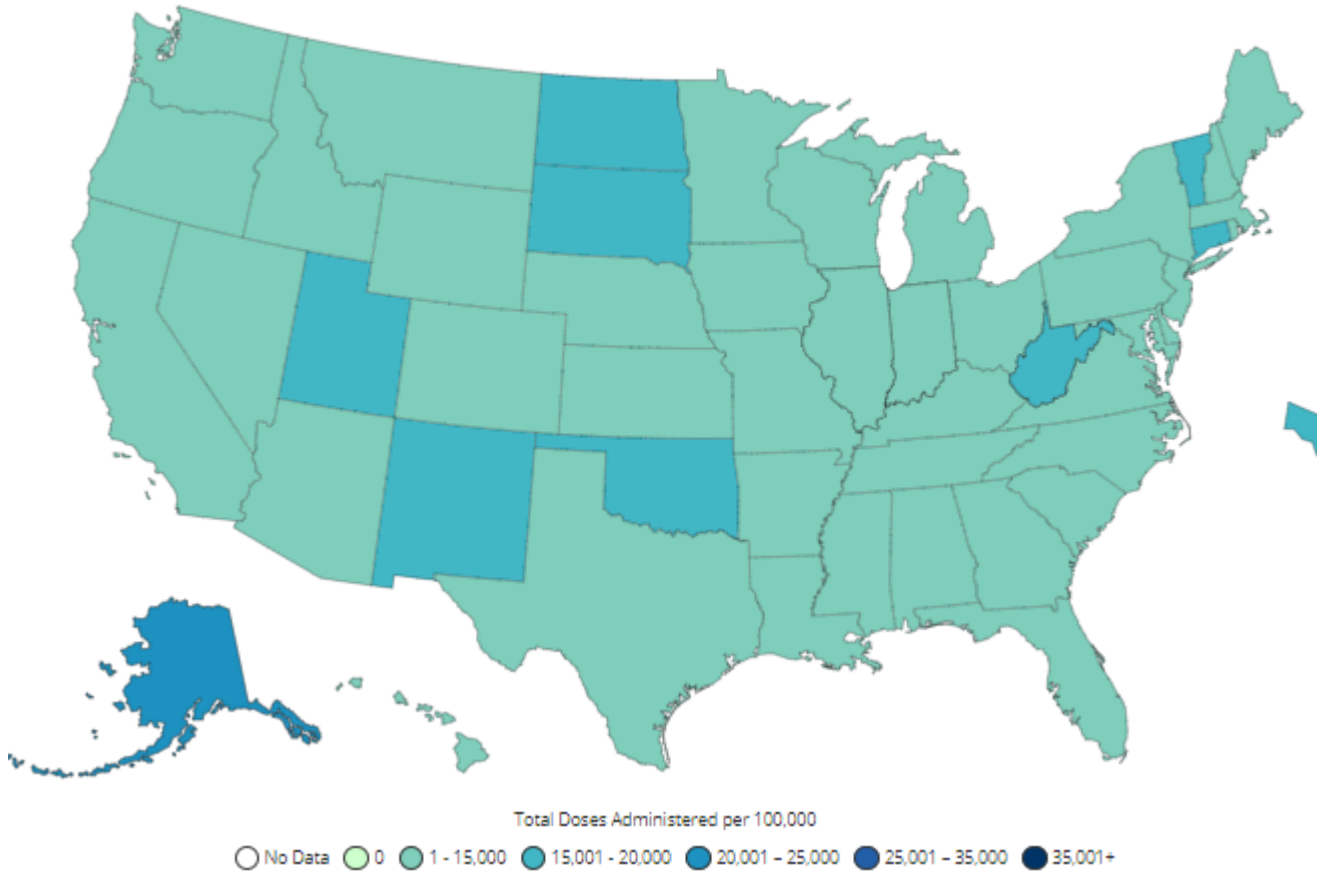

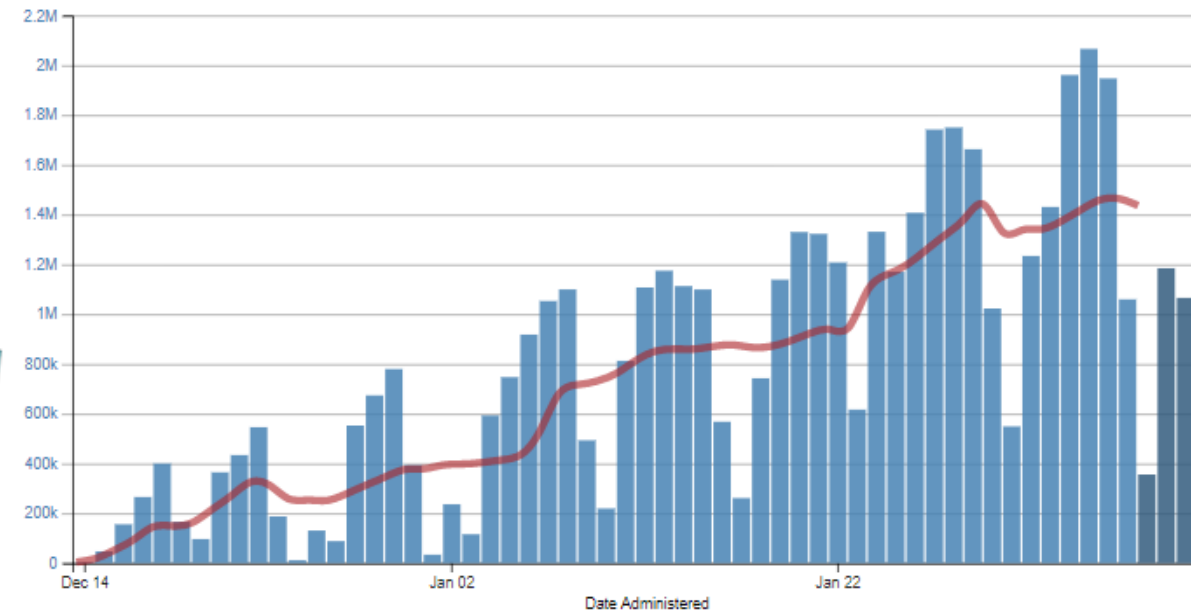

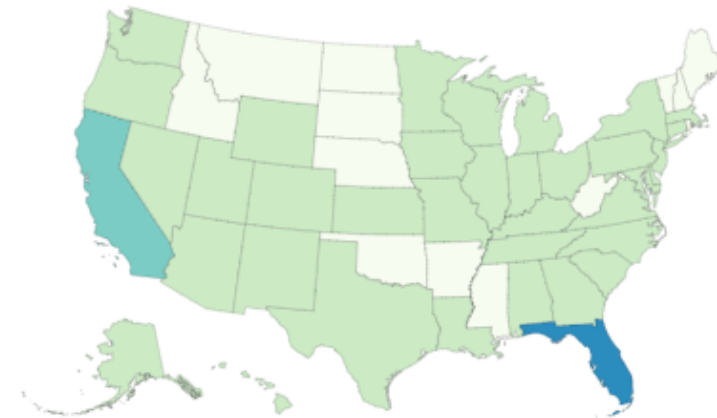

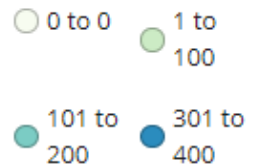

VT Vaccine Implementation Advisory Committee

Chronic conditions remain under discussion by subgroup – ***DRAFT***, not final

- Mostly following CDC chronic conditions list with a few exceptions
- Adding Type 1 diabetes
- Trying to define heart disease with more lay person clarity
- Considering patients with intellectual disability
- Vermont is planning self-attestation since it would be a major logistical challenge for health care providers

VDH Update: Current **Gathering** Restrictions (2/11/21)

- ❑ You **cannot gather w/people you don't live with**: incl. all inside/outside social/entertainment gatherings, in public & private spaces. E.g. cannot go to family member/friend's house or restaurant w/someone you don't live with.
- ❑ **Visitors to Vermont** cannot gather w/VTers/people from another household (**HH**); includes sharing lodging w/another HH. Travelers may not stay w/VT host or stay in VT lodging/short-term rental w/another HH – even if completed quarantine, or intend to quarantine w/another HH.
- ❑ People who **live alone** may gather w/one other household; people can **take in/shelter** those from another HH from a dangerous, unhealthy/unsafe situation.
- ❑ You **can** do **outdoor recreation and fitness activities** w/people you don't live with: biking, hiking, walking, running, hunting and fishing, skiing, snowboarding, skating, snow machining and other no-contact outdoor activities. Maintain 6 ft. distance; mask at all times. Do not gather at trailheads, access areas or other outdoor facilities before or after the activity.

Reminder: Special Enrollment Period

- As announced by AHS Secy. Mike Smith 2/9/21: **Special Enrollment Period** (SEP) for Marketplace health insurance coverage in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.
- 2/15/21 – 5/15/21: individuals and families may apply/enroll in needed health coverage.
- Offered by SOV for uninsured & non-Medicaid eligible.

From the CDC: Recent MMWRs



- COVID-19 Vaccination Intent, Perceptions, and Reasons for Not Vaccinating Among Groups Prioritized for Early Vaccination — U.S., Sept. & Dec. 2020
(*Early Release 2/9/21*)
- Intent to receive COVID-19 vax incr. from 39.4%-49.1% among adults & across all priority groups; nonintent decr. from 38.1%-32.1%. Despite decreases in nonintent from Sept.-Dec., **younger adults**, women, non-Hispanic Black adults, adults in nonmetropolitan areas, & adults w/less educ./income & w/o health ins. have est. nonintent to receive COVID-19 vax.
- Maximizing Fit for Cloth and Medical Procedure Masks to Improve Performance and Reduce SARS-CoV-2 Transmission and Exposure, 2021
(*Early Release 2/10/21*)
 - CDC conducted expts. to assess 2 ways to improve fit of med. proc. masks: fit cloth mask over med. proc. mask, & knotting ear loops of med. proc. mask/tucking in/flattening extra material close to face. Each substantially improved source control/reduced wearer exp.
- Coming soon: variants; updated school guidance.

VT School Guidance: School/Youth Sports

- ❑ Posted 2/9/21:

- ❑ Feb. 12: resume interscholastic/youth competition for basketball, hockey, indoor soccer, futsal, broomball, volleyball.
- ❑ Indiv. sports/low-no contact: bowling, dance, gymnastics – virtual.
- ❑ Close proximity sports: no more than 2 games/7d. & minimum 3d. between games. No spectators at indoor events – only key personnel.
- ❑ RTP after illness
- ❑ Mask mandate extended to officials of indoor sports events; electronic, handheld whistle or whistle mask/gaiter at all times.

Friday Media Briefing (2/12/21)

Governor Phil Scott

- Beg Tuesday, 2/16: opening registration 70+. >85% of 75+ have scheduled/received vaccine.
- You may ask why other states have broader eligibility than VT – but *“just saying eligible doesn’t mean have enough doses.”*
- Will extend State of Emergency for another month.
- Vaccine supply news: increased Pfizer production
- Fauci: by April, genl. pop. may have broad access to vaccines.
- Last wk. announced return of certain sports – today, music.
- Won’t look the same – but ***“heard from pediatricians that our kids not OK.”***



Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



AOE Secretary Dan French

- ❑ Testing for week of Jan. 31; participation rate lower (27%); ~1600 tests; 2 cases. Pos. rate 0.12% (cases from Rutland, Franklin Cos.)
- ❑ This week: 33% partic. w/4 cases (all in Franklin Co.) for 0.35%. Pos. rate has incr. over past few weeks, but still signif. < state rate. Some Richford schools will move to remote instruction.
- ❑ V. productive mtg. on music: guidance will be published next week (based on natl. work) as stand-alone guidance (currently imbedded).
 - ▣ All performers 6 X 6 ft. distance; trombones 6 X 9 ft.
 - ▣ Woodwind/brass slit mask; when not playing; multi-level bell covers)
- ❑ Air in rehearsal spaces 3 complete exchange/hr. No audiences during performances.

Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)

AOE Secretary Dan French

- ❑ Thank VT Music Education Assoc. leadership AND **Drs. Raszka & Lee** – “*very generous with their time.*”
- ❑ Mitigation measures for music are complex; increased confidence that schools can implement.
- ❑ Cumulative impact weighing more in decision-making.
- ❑ Will review performing arts/theater.
- ❑ As we contemplate recovery phase, these are key strategies to restore normalcy.
- ❑ Responsibility to do more – show others how to recover by returning to more IP instruction & arts.



Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



AHS Secretary Mike Smith:

- ❑ Good news: starting next week (2/16), open 70+ age group reg.
 - ▣ Reg. to begin 8:15 a.m. – online or call **1-855-722-7878**.
 - ▣ ALL PLANS contingent on federal vaccine supply/distribution.
- ❑ Marks beginning of **Phase 3 – new age group**.
- ❑ HCWs remain eligible; contact hospital for appt.
- ❑ Walgreen's will join federal pharmacy program (starting today for 75+):
 - ▣ Rec'd. 2K doses: 20 locations (Benn., Bratt, Bellow's Falls, Manchester)
- ❑ Tuesday for 70+: smallest age 33,200 – should complete relatively quickly
- ❑ Homebound program expanding; will begin to include non-HHA clients.
- ❑ Next week new health care sites: Copley, Gifford, NCH (will start 70+)
- ❑ Phase 5: 16-64 w/high-risk conditions.

Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



VDH Commissioner Levine

- Pace of additional deaths has slowed considerably.
- Quite a bit of fluctuation recently in VT case counts
- Despite fluctuation, abundant testing available almost every day.
- Positivity rate 1.6 – 1.7% range consistently.
- Would normally be seeing significant influenza – very little at this time.
- Outbreaks in LTCFs – small #; cumulatively very few cases.
- Hospitalizations & ICU bed occupancy decreasing.
- Rising case counts in 3 counties:
 - Past 2 wks. Bennington: 244 cases w/51 assoc. w/active outbreaks.

Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



VDH Commissioner Levine

- Benn. Co. (cont'd.) above is sign of signif. community transmission of virus. Several towns had been involved, but this week only one town.
- Rutland: still high rates; only a few towns w/increase.
- Franklin Co.: 244 cases, 68 assoc. w/active outbreaks. Several towns w/increases – many due to household & community transmission.
 - Actively increasing but at lower absolute # - “goal is to nip that in the bud.” Reinforce PH guidance and testing!
- Message to Vermonters: ***“we need you to do your part.”***

Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



VDH Commissioner Levine

- ❑ Through wastewater testing, BTV detected 2 instances of B.1.1.7.
 - ❑ Strong indication that these are in the community; still need to confirm through patient samples
- ❑ Mutations/variants expected over time: B.1.1.7 thought to be more transmissible. Found in 34 states to date.
- ❑ CDC research re: “double masking” – cloth over surgical & knotted/tucked masks offer more protection (lab experiments).
- ❑ Just released new guidance: **fully vaccinated, exposed persons do NOT need to quarantine if at least 2 wks. since 2nd dose (current vaccines), w/in 3 mos. of last dose, and no symptoms since current exposure.** Exception for vaccinated inpatients & LTCF residents. Cont'd. next slide – **does NOT apply to travel.**

Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



VDH Commissioner Levine

- ❑ VT will follow this new CDC guidance for fully vaccinated persons ***following COVID exposure ONLY.***
- ❑ VT currently **CONTINUES to require quarantine for fully vaccinated persons post travel – not yet making changes to this guidance.**
- ❑ Being very thoughtful about this – hope to have more to say next week.
- ❑ New age band: reminder you may create account ahead of reg. opening.
- ❑ Visit healthvermont.gov/myvaccine
- ❑ For 75+, still plenty of appts. available statewide – esp. encourage Benn., Franklin & Rutland Cos.
- ❑ Success in LTCFs will help us prepare to consider lifting restrictions.

Friday Media Briefing (cont'd.)



VDH Commissioner Levine

- Upcoming school vacations: please avoid indoor get-togethers; but w/masks & 6-ft. spaces, can enjoy outdoors.
- You can do **outdoor recreation and fitness activities** with people you don't live with, like biking, hiking, walking, running, hunting and fishing, skiing, snowboarding, skating, snow machining and other no-contact outdoor activities. However, you must stay at least 6 feet away from people you don't live with and wear a mask at all times. Do not gather at trailheads, access areas or other outdoor facilities before or after the activity.

Friday Potpourri



Pediatric Case

- Pediatric patient with anosmia & ageusia X 24-36 hours; otherwise asymptomatic & subsequent PCR test negative.
- Could this be a false negative – do we have data on this question?
 - Limited data and multiple factors: multiple different PCR assays being used in VT (e.g., 4 at UVMMC, VPHL, Broad, possibly others at community hospitals).
 - We generally do **not** repeat testing on patients – older data from UVM MC (thru mid-April 2020): 24/228 patients went from negative to positive (~10%), but 21 of 24 were in nursing home patients w/rpt. test due to **outbreak** (thus, not clear if pos. at time of 1st swab or developed infection in interval between tests). If **exclude** rpt. testing due to screening protocol, **3** patients tested positive on repeat testing = ~98% sensitivity.
- This patient: consultation with VDH sought. [Note current “return to school” protocol: student may return to school if PCR neg. & no symptoms X 24 hours.]

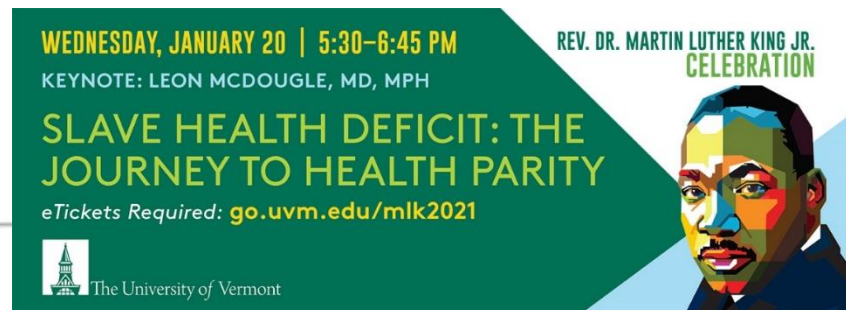
