






VDH Weekly Data Summary: Symptom Onset to PH Response

- 10-19 & 20-29 yo pts. (& HCWs) tested more quickly after symptoms than general pop.
 - "Why" unknown: adults more likely to dismiss symptoms? Concern to get kids back to school?
- Pediatricians/family physicians doing a great job – thank you for your role in testing!
- However, some cases noted where pediatric patients sent home from school; alternate dx assigned at medical home w/o testing.
- Please continue to reinforce importance of (timely) testing!

Teens and people in their 20s are tested sooner after starting to feel sick. People in their 50s and 60s are tested later after starting to feel sick.





There are enough appointments for everyone who is eligible. Appointments are required, and clinics won't be able to accept walk-ins.



COVID-19 Vaccination Scheduling at Kinney Drugs in Vermont

Currently, the State of Vermont allows Kinney Drugs Pharmacists to administer COVID-19 vaccines to Vermont residents age 75+ BY ONLINE APPOINTMENT ONLY. You do NOT need to preregister on the Vermont Department of Health website to schedule an appointment at Kinney Drugs.



Total Doses Administered Reported to the CDC by State/Territory and for Selected Federal Entities per 100,000



In the News: Vaccine Distribution Inequity

- MS: largest Black pop. in U.S. at 38%, but only 19% have been vaccinated; 58% white pop. have rec'd. 70% of allotment "one of worst cases in U.S."
- Not due to distrust/hesitancy but barriers to access: lack of public transportation (geographic distance); pharmacies; access to care
- Only 4/18 MS counties w/barriers have vaccine sites.
- Tulane School of Public Health: modeling to identify communities at risk for inequity & develop mitigation strategies

- Andy Slavitt, White House Sr. Advisor for COVID Response
 - Former Acting CMS Administrator
 - Initiatives: increasing vaccination, work force
- Rochelle Walensky, MD MPH, CDC Director & ATSDR Administrator
 - □ Variants now seen in 699 cases across 34 states, 690 = B.1.1.7.
 - Continue all mitigation strategies & get vaccinated when you are able.
- □ Anthony Fauci, MD: since demand>supply, focus on 1st doses?
 - Science for Pfizer & Moderna: prime boost gives max. response to 94-95% efficacy. Why not study single dose? Not unreasonable to suggest study, but practical barriers: #s required to study w/currently available vaccine would take several mos. for meaningful answer. By then, may be somewhat moot.





Today's White House COVID-19 Response Briefing (cont'd.)

- Fauci (cont'd.) what we know from orig. vaccine studies: Ab response was above protective threshold (against wild type) & boost was 10-fold greater. W/that increase, also increase breadth of response both wild/circulating AND variants B.1.1.7 & B1.351
 - Anticipate increased genetic sequencing (3-4X per Walensky)
- □ If only single dose, if get sub-optimal response; may inadvertently select for more mutants ("due to the way viruses respond to pressure").
- □ Current goal: assure on-time 2nd dose
- Projection is that B.1.1.7 will likely become dominant in U.S. by end March. Current mRNA vaccines are quite effective against that variant (less so against B.1.351).





Today's White House COVID-19 Response Briefing (cont'd.)

Walensky:

- We have yet to control this pandemic & still have emerging threat of variants; thus, states should not be relaxing mitigation strategies.
- Schools new guidance expected soon. Most infections come into schools through community – very little in-school transmission, esp. w/masking & distancing. If we want schools open safely, must decrease community spread.
- "CDC guidance on school reopening will be coming in the days ahead... look forward to sharing."

VT School Guidance: Music

- Meeting later this week to revisit this topic Current guidance: "Administrators should make decisions about restarting or continuing in-person performing arts classes/extracurricular activities in collaboration w/local health officials based on a # of factors, incl. level of community transmission.
- Singing/playing wind instruments generates respiratory droplets and aerosols that may contain virus if infected. Consider: practice in small groups w/same 5-10 students always rehearsing together; reinforce masks when not playing instrument that requires mouth use; maintaining distance; install physical barriers; eliminate shared items; maintain adequate vent. in rehearsal space.
- □ Band: "bell covers" (brass instruments); bags with hand openings (woodwind).
- Theater & dance: rehearse/hold performances outdoors; no props/costumes/wigs. Some guiding principles for youth sports may be relevant to extracurricular dance activities.


From Friday Media Briefing (2/5/21)

Agency of Natural Resources Secretary Julie Moore

- □ Feb. 12: resume interscholastic/youth competition
- Basketball, hockey, indoor soccer, futsal, broomball, volleyball.
- Indiv. sports/low-no contact: swimming, bowling, figure skating, dance, gymnastics.
- Close proximity sports: no more than 2 games/7d. & minimum 3d.
 between games. No spectators at indoor events only key personnel.
- □ Encourage look for creative solutions e.g., virtual viewing.
- □ Updated guidance on SOV web site by end of day Monday, 2/8/21
- Mask mandate extended to referees & officials of indoor sports events.
- Possible correction: reassessing statement that "no evidence of virus

- America's Mothers Are in Crisis: Is anyone listening to them?
 - Almost 1 million mothers have left the workforce; Black, Hispanic and single mothers among the hardest hit
 - Almost 1 in 4 children experience food insecurity in 2020 relationship to maternal income loss
 - □ >75% parents with children ages 8 12 yo: "school year uncertainty" causing stress
- Three American Mothers On the Brink
 - "The relentless need to find the perfect solution offers the illusion of control...When you find yourself mentally spinning in this way, recognize that you have a choice in how you react to and engage with your thoughts...Drawing overt attention to your mind cultivates psychological flexibility, which gives you the emotional space to question whether this line of thinking is productive, or even realistic.


