

## Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Guidance: Home-Based Service Delivery

**SUMMARY** – Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) continues to spread and has been confirmed in Vermont. The Vermont Department of Health is recommending the following guidance for home-based services delivery.

## **Non-essential Services**

Suspend all non-essential face-to-face visits. Agencies/programs are encouraged to use remote/virtual visit options, where available.

## **Essential Services**

Essentials services should determine if remote or virtual visits are an option in accordance with their statutory and funding requirements. In cases where home-based service delivery is required, use the following screening questions to determine if the visit should continue. These questions should be asked of the consumer/family and of the worker:

- 1. Have you been in close contact with a person who has COVID-19?
- 2. Have you felt unwell with respiratory symptoms in the last few days? For example, have you had a cough, high temperature, shortness of breath, or difficulty breathing?

The Agency of Human Services departments will make decisions about essential versus non-essential home-based services, together with their service providers.
