



Race Distribution Among COVID-19 Cases in Vermont

Race is determined by either provider report or self-disclosure during interview.

Cases represented through 4/14/2020

n=323 (435 had unknown race)

Race	Count	Percent
American Indian or Alaska Native	1	0.3%
Asian	6	1.9%
Black or African American	6	1.9%
White	303	93.8%
Other	7	2.2%

Ethnicity Distribution Among COVID-19 Cases in Vermont

Ethnicity is determined by either provider report or self-disclosure during interview.

ĸ	Non-Hispanic	282	97.9%






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Situation update: Percent Positive Tests

Situation update: Testing

- Public Health Laboratory: 317 tests yesterday; anticipates 184 today.
- UVMMC lab: 34 rapid (45-minute) tests; 43 additional using in-house test
- Broad (MIT): 80 tests
- Mayo: none
- Pediatric testing HAN in process

COVID-19 Impact on Medical Education in Vermont

Adapted Curriculum

- Vermont Integrated Curriculum is all online and continues to use Active Learning
- Non-clinical courses offered such as a COVID public health course, Medical Spanish, and an introduction to Telemedicine

Impact on Clinical Experiences

- Doctoring in Vermont (first years) and clinical rotations (third and fourth years) suspended until further notice per AAMC guidelines
- Faculty are being creative to open opportunities for students to have clinical experiences before residency applications are due
- Fourth years offered an early April 20th graduation date

Volunteering in the Community

- LCOM COVID-19 Task Force organizes non-clinical volunteering in the community including a PPE drive, managing the supply room in the Patrick gym field hospital, and shopping/babysitting services for essential workers
- UVM students created the **Medical Student COVID-19 Action Network**, a national database of projects for medical schools across the country to share their COVID volunteer projects
