- "You will only see appointments for the Pfizer vaccine, since that is the only vaccine that is authorized for people age 16 and 17.

- Parent/guardian must review consent forms & check the box giving their consent.
  for you to get the vaccine. Consent built into the registration process, so parent/ guardian does not need to accompany youth.
- If appt. directly through Kinney Drugs, CVS, Walgreens or Northfield Pharmacy, check their confirmation email for instructions re: consent from a parent/guardian

# VDH: Getting the COVID-19 Vaccine

#### Special instructions for those who live another state:

- □ "You can still get a vaccine in Vermont if
  - You work in an occupation/setting in Vermont that is currently eligible.
  - You moved to Vermont w/in last 6 mos. w/intention of becoming a resident & are in age, occupation or another group currently eligible.
- April 30: VT expects to open registration to college students who are residents of another state & do <u>not</u> intend to stay in VT for the summer, <u>and</u> people who live part of the year in Vermont will be based on the vaccine supply from the federal government."
  Set up account now, so you'll be ready to make appt. when eligible.

# Tuesday Media Briefing (4/20/21)

Modeling – Commissioner Pieciak:

- Steady declines give us greater confidence of moving in right direction on track to meet May 1 goals and "normal summer."
- 797 new cases this week; 252 less than last; 435 fewer than week before (was all-time high). 7d. case rate fell 24%; down 39% since 4/1 as VT remains leaders in testing/capita.
- Younger demographic = primary reason why cases falling so nicely: down 33% over past 2 wks. (incl. down on college campuses).
- "Important point: lower case #s likely not result of vaccine since just became fully eligible & coverage in this age group still relatively low – seems more likely due to behavior change & follow PH guidance. Thank young Vermonters as we continue to slow the spread – request that they keep it up.







Modeling – Commissioner Pieciak:

- □ 11/14 VT cos. saw case rates fall this week; even w/o decrease still ~mild incr.
- CDC & Wyman forecast cases decline in coming wks.
- □ Even w/J & J pause, VT on pace to meet 5/1 vaccine range (VT Forward plan).
- □ Est. 120 lives saved by vaccine in VT to date i.e., ~1/2 of deaths to date.
- Hospitalization rates overall stable; fatalities down compared to March; expect cont'd decrease.
- □ Regional cases down ~10%; decreased in all states except Maine.









AHS Deputy Secretary Jenney Samuelson – (Secretary Smith off this week)

- $\square$  Vaccine registration opened 4/19 to all Vermonters 16+.
- Just >47K 16-29 have made appointments; represents just >40% of that age group
- □ BIPOC: 18K appointments made.
- 295,128K Vermonters have received at least one dose vaccine as of 4/20 a.m.

#### **VDH** Commissioner Levine

- Continue w/predominantly good news theme: lower daily case #s; positivity rate down to 1.5%. 23 in hosp. on 4/20; 6 in ICU.
- Reporting system for data undergoing scheduled maintenance. Post update case info will be assigned to day cases would have been reported.
- Now 1.5m. tests in VT; >373K people tested. Early in pandemic we didn't know if we'd have enough supplies to test the next day; vs. last month high of almost 19K tests in one day.
- Thank you to labs, data staff but really Vermonters have helped us reach this point – their willingness to get tested & understand importance. Still free/easy. New travel policy requires w/in 3d.





#### **VDH** Commissioner Levine

- Vaccine breakthrough cases are expected no vaccine is 100% effective at preventing illness.
- CDC new data(4/13): >75m in U.S. vax since 12/14/20 w/5,814 reports of breakthrough cases in 43 states (voluntary reporting).
  - "Rare events" breakthrough rate = .007%; cases at mild end spectrum.
  - 45% of the reported infections among 60+ yo; 65% were female; 29% reported as asymptomatic; 7% known to be hospitalized & 1% died.
  - Of the 396 hospitalized patients, 133 (34%) were reported as asymptomatic or hospitalized for a reason not related to COVID-19.
- □ Last week, 104 such cases in VT; now updated to 125.





**Governor Phil Scott** 

□ Just off w/White House call (w/Drs. Fauci, Walensky, etc.)



- This week state supply = level. Pharm will see sl increase of 800K doses in U.S. so about 8K doses for VT (Moderna & Pfizer only).
  No J & J this week.
- □ J & J will be making more at a facility different from Baltimore.
- VT Forward plan tied to vaccine rates. When we meet them & are able to move forward depends on Vermonters signing up – please sign up so we can all have a more normal summer to enjoy.





#### **VDH** Commissioner Levine

- Good news: earlier this month Pfizer req. expand to adolescent age group 12-15 yo. Pfizer/Biontech Phase 3 clinical trials show vaccine safe & almost 100% effective in this age group. Data must still be reviewed by experts – but may be able to begin vaccinating this group by May or June. Ready to use lessons learned to date & critical partnerships to vaccinate younger VTers when time comes.
- Q: How long will vaccine infrastructure remain in place? Levine: referenced VDH IZ Program: "this is the actual structure by which we administer vaccines. Will transition sometime after 7/4 to this; clinical community will have more opportunity to do that. May depend on storage requirements, etc. We haven't discussed extensively.

### **COVID-19** Vaccine for Adolescents

Clinical question: patient in need of MCV#2 but also needed COVID-19 #2 – how to address timing?

- (from Bill Raszka, MD): my bias is that the COVID timing should take priority. Unless the vaccine is needed for urgent care (such as a tetanus shot after a deep wound), would schedule routine vaccinations so that they are given either at least two weeks before a COVID vaccine or at least two weeks after a COVID vaccine.
- May result in additional visits, but if counseling for the vaccination has already been done during the health supervision visit, the patient could simply return for the routine vaccination without a physician visit at that particular time.
- There is always the risk that we will have some difficulty getting the patient back for the vaccine – but these vaccines are not required for school entry and we have ample time to catch up.
