






VDH COVID-19 Vaccine Dashboard










Interpretive Summary for May 14, 2021

Slay the Virus

On May 10, 2021, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for use in adolescents ages 12-15 years. On May 14, CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) issued an interim recommendation in support of the EUA for the prevention of COVID-19 in adolescents ages 12-15 years. Additionally, CDC recently announced that fully vaccinated people, including adolescents, no longer need to wear masks in most situations. These announcements come as many families are looking forward to summer plans, including camp, youth sports, and travel. Authorization also comes as young people make up a rising proportion of new coronavirus cases in the United States.

Vaccinating adolescents is an important step toward stopping the spread of COVID-19. Yet, adolescent vaccination has been met with mixed reactions, with some parents eager to vaccinate their children against COVID-19, and others expressing hesitancy. Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine was found to be <u>safe and effective</u> in adolescents between the ages of 12-15 years in clinical trials. <u>Side effects</u> were generally consistent with those experienced by people ages 16-25 years. 





Home-Based Vaccine for CYSHN (join us 5/17 for more details)

- Homebound Vaccination Program: home health agencies & emergency medical services (EMS) offer in-home vax visits to eligible pts. unable to travel.
- □ **2-tiered approach** to assist CYSHN getting vaccinated at their residence:
 - **Tier 1 (preferred approach):** CYSHN patients identified by PCPs, HHAs, Specialty Providers & other health care organizations. Providers can request that a patient be added to the centralized vaccination list by emailing AHS.VDHHOCCommander@vermont.gov.
 - Tier 2: VDH will open existing call center for caregivers & self-advocates to request a visit; requests will be evaluated by VDH staff with expertise in working with CYSHN & directed to appropriate resources. If pt. qualifies for home visit, will be added to centralized vaccination list. If pt. does not qualify, will be directed to appropriate local vaccine clinic & if needed, care managers will share transportation resource information. (Note: call ctr. currently staffed by Medicaid chronic care nurses; CSHN staff will take over.)
- Encourage health care partners will screen & identify as many qualified patients
 as possible in lists that can be shared with vaccinating partners.





Friday Media Briefing (5/14/21)

Governor Phil Scott

- Already hit June 1 Vermont Forward target so later today move into Step 3, >2 wks. ahead of schedule thank you, Vermonters!
- No more testing required for travel; capacity limits increase in/outdoors
- Gathering: 1 unvax/50 SF; up to 300 indoors & 900 outdoors; any #vaccinated in both.
- Later today, extend Executive Order X one month: update mask mandate to follow CDC updated guidance. Fully vax no mask in & out; no concern w/physical distancing. "Based on science & data."
- Ok to be uncomfortable/hesitant. But if fully vax, very little risk.
- If not fully vaccinated, continue mask mandate.
- VT will receive addtl. 5K Pfizer next wk. (new federal reallocation prog)





AOE Secretary Dan French

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

- Setting up vax clinics for 12-15 yo; many at school sites.
- AOE has model letters, vax info for families. Walk-in appts. available consent may be provided in-person (parent may come in w/student; complete/sign & send in; vaccine clinic staff can obtain by phone.
- For questions, consult local pediatrician & health care professionals.
- Thank you peds & HCP community, school nurses for leadership. Role of SN is complex; ours are talented group who deserve gratitude/appreciation.
- □ Survey of learning modes: April 11% overall remote, 35% full IP, 54% hybrid; IP incr. by 3% vs. March (esp. HS); elem. 50%; MS 4% incr.
- □ HS had largest incr. Mar-April: IP doubled 17% (prob. change in dist. related)
- Expect to publish **fall guidance** later this month; prepare for **full IP learning**.

- Doses available for walk-ins at most sites; parent must consent
- AAP-VT hosting series of virtual forums to discuss vaccine in adolescence & answer questions; includes VDH School Liaisons
- Two sessions last night were well-received

Special vaccine clinics:

- May 15: Route 100 "barnstorming"; May 20 North Beach, BTV (walk-in); EMS clinics, including May 22 Church St. (BTV)
- 66 clinics hosted in schools: healthvermont.gov/myvaccine
- □ Families w/children will be eligible for **any site** offering Pfizer vaccine; all sites open to public.
- Special sites for restaurant, hospitality workers (J & J, walk-in) –
 e.g., restaurants, ski areas, etc.
- You will find the atmosphere "festive."





Vaccine Clinics (cont'd.)

- In partnership with the Vermont Chamber of Commerce and Vermont
 Department of Tourism and Marketing, VDH will host walk-in COVID-19 vaccine clinics for restaurant, hospitality, and tourism workers over the next week.
- Initial wave of clinics at seven locations, with each site offering J & J vaccine for hospitality workers on a walk-in basis. Clinics will be staged at restaurants, lodging properties, ski resorts, and other tourism attractions in an effort to bring the vaccine directly to the workers of this sector.
- The first wave of clinics will be in Waterbury, Middlebury, Woodstock, Waitsfield, Windsor, South Burlington, and Warren. To see all dates, times, and locations for these hospitality worker vaccine clinics, please visit https://accd.vermont.gov/vaccine.
- More than a dozen additional clinics, including in Rutland, Killington, Stowe, and
 Vergennes are being planned now & will be added as details are confirmed.

VDH Commissioner Levine

- □ VT case rate 64.7/100K vs. natl. average almost 74.7/100K.
- May 13: for first time since Nov., UVM MC had no COVID patients.
- VT will follow new CDC guidance announced yesterday.
- a main reasons: Studies show vaccines effective in real-world settings; proven effective against variants circulating in U.S.; if you are vaccinated, less likely to spread.
- □ Points to confidence in vaccines: "vaccination = protection"
- Exceptions: not healthcare settings (e.g., hosps., LTCFs); children too young/their schools; some immunocompromised; corr. facilities, homeless shelters, public transportation & where required by federal/tribal/local laws.
- "Reentry anxiety" don't judge those not comfortable w/close proximity or

VDH Commissioner Levine

- □ ACIP recommended FDA EUA for 12 15 yo (5/12/21)
- VT moved quickly to open registration yesterday: clinical trial data shows vaccines safe/effective in this age group.
- AAP-VT hosting public forums timed to precede vaccine clinics.
- Listen to those pediatricians w/adolescents in their own households pediatricians spend much time helping keep kids well w/many tools, include vaccination.
- >4K VT children/adolescents tested positive since onset pandemic.
- Urge parents to talk to children re: vaccine ahead of time.
- "Thank you pediatricians, family practitioners, all HC colleagues."

CDC Updated Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People







CDC Updated Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People (May 13, 2021)

Key Points

- Recommendations apply to non-healthcare settings.
- Fully vaccinated people can:
 - Resume activities without wearing masks or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance
 - Resume domestic travel and refrain from testing before or after travel or selfquarantine after travel
 - Refrain from testing before leaving the United States for international travel (unless required by the destination) and refrain from self-quarantine after arriving back in the United States
 - Refrain from testing following a known exposure, if asymptomatic, with some exceptions for specific settings





CDC Updated Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People (May 13, 2021)

Key Points (cont'd.)

- Recommendations apply to non-healthcare settings.
- Fully vaccinated people can:
 - Refrain from quarantine following a known exposure if asymptomatic
 - Refrain from routine screening testing if feasible
- For now, fully vaccinated people should continue to:
 - Get tested if experiencing COVID-19 symptoms
 - Follow CDC and health department travel requirements and recommendations
