



Situation update

Total Cases 940 Currently Hospitalized Hospitalized Under Investigation Total People Recovered 815 Deaths 54 Total Tests 23,825 People Being Monitored People Completed Monitoring 860 Last Updated: 5/18/2020, 1:23 EDT


- Corrected case summary from dashboard
- Combined VDH Public Health Lab and UVMMC Lab: 724 tests
 - Zero positives among hundreds of most recent tests from pop-up testing sites
- Hospitalized patients:1 patient in ICU, 1 patient on ventilator

Reminder: "Total People Recovered" based on the number of confirmed positive cases (VT residents & non-VT residents who tested positive in VT; does not include deaths or patients currently hospitalized).

- Expected today: VDH HAN today on pediatric COVID cases
- Reminder: MIS-C
 - Now characterized as: Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome in Children (MIS-C) Associated with Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

 - Now reportable to VDH



Media Briefing (Friday, 5/15/20)

Governor Scott:

- State of emergency extended to June 15
 - Expect outdoor dining, close-contact businesses (salons/other indoor businesses) to open by June 1 (if case rates remain low)
 - Expect state's limit on gatherings (now at 10) to be expanded to 25
- Lodging guidance effective May 22) inns/other lodging operations, short-term rentals, campgrounds and marinas:
 - May accept overnight reservations from people who have met 14-day quarantine requirements VT ACCD): must complete questionnaire affirming quarantine requirements met
 - Remain at 25% of capacity; gatherings limited to 10 people
 - Maintain guest log in case needed for contact tracing

Governor Scott:

Vermont cases minimal, but regional data concerning:

■ NH: 400 cases in past week

MA: 6678 cases

■ NY: 14,500 cases

■ VT team to conduct detailed regional modeling this week (expect Friday, 5/22)

□ If continued low case rate, will proceed with opening as discussed 5/15

Wednesday, 5/20: expect announcement of major economic package
 Secretary Moore:

 State Parks update: maintain distance, cloth masks, reduce touchpoints, bring supply of sanitizing products & other supplies





Today's Media Briefing

Commissioner Levine:

- Surveillance update:
 - Last week, one additional death
 - Report last evening: >700 tests no new cases
- Curve "continuing to flatten; low daily rate new cases w/minor oscillations
- □ % pos. generally <5% (sometimes 1-3%)</p>
- Syndromic surveillance (EDs, UCCs): essentially no influenza being reported now (so consider COVID test if symptomatic)
- Isolation vs. quarantine (stay home, telework, etc.)
 - □ Isolation having COVID-19, sick w/sxs or tested positive w/o sxs
 - Quarantine no sxs but may have been in close contact w/positive or return from



Today's Media Briefing

Commissioner Levine (cont'd.):

- "What happens when you let your guard down?"
 - Must continue handwashing, respiratory etiquette, social (physical) distancing, masking
 - □ Clinton Co. NY had followed 46 cases w/COVID-19
 - □ Cases almost doubled 1d. over WE: 9 new cases; 27 close contacts all related to "parties" in Plattsburgh.

Testing Updates

- Exploring new testing site options:
 - Increase testing at FQHCs (receive federal funding for this)
 - Pharmacies? No details but will follow
- Abbott ID NOW machines will NOT be distributed to VT hospitals
- Serology Work Group will address broader questions re: general testing strategies (e.g., PCR) to help inform our path forward
- □ Follow up re: testing plans for health care practice settings
 - Exploring "requirement" for plan submission expect clarification (this group's response and feedback has informed policy!)
 - Working on next steps re: feedback; checklist; etc. (thank you, Paul Parker!)





Upcoming Topics

- Testing of HCWs: how does this work in practice?
- Continue to follow developments in telehealth/telephone coverage
- Health care "restart" details
- Summer camps/other recreational activities following emerging guidance
- OneCare Vermont all-payer model adjustments
- School reopening/reentry; adolescent well care; IZ catch-up (flu)
- Pediatric Multi-System Inflammatory Syndrome
