


Feature | Returning to Play After Coronavirus Infection: A Perspective From Pediatric Cardiologists






- Significance: Myocarditis evaluation
  - Cause of sudden cardiac death during exercise in young athletes
- There are "gray" areas
  - Moderate symptoms
  - Age of child
  - Intensity of sport
- Long-term data not yet known



### Children with COVID-19...


- May be less symptomatic/milder cases
- Much variation in youth sports & levels of high school competition
- Pediatric population is less reliant on standard adult cardiac testing (EKG/ECHO/Stress Test/Troponin)



### **3 IMPORTANT QUESTIONS**

- How recent was the infection?
- How serious was it?
- What is the physical activity/sport being considered?

- \* Depending on the patient and situation, it may also be reasonable to follow the recent adult recommendations for return-to-play (+echo/troponin)

### **Quick Takes**

- Returning to sports participation after a COVID infection will be a significant question posed to pediatric providers in the coming months
- The approach to sports participation clearance in pediatric patients should differ from the approach in adult patients
- Most pediatric patients will be able to be easily cleared for participation without extensive cardiac testing, but pediatric providers should ensure patients have fully recovered and have no evidence of myocardial injury

Myocarditis concern(s)?

→ REFER!

- Following infection, children should be asymptomatic for 2 weeks before clearance.
  - Refrain from sports during illness + 2 weeks
  - If cardiac testing during the acute infection (mild cases) was not required, then it is unlikely necessary for clearance.

  - Effective immediately, the AAP Bylaws are amended!
  - "The AAP does not discriminate on the basis of race, ethnicity, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, or national origin."

# Tuesday Media Briefing (September 29, 2020)

### Governor Scott:

- Vermont doing well, but cont'd. upticks, in U.S., our region.
  - Dr. Fauci said upticks not inevitable here in Vermont.
  - Governor following data from other states: HI, MT, WY had been doing well but now increasing.
  - Focus here on continuing slow reopening and following guidance.
- Continued focus on schools, including more in-person instruction.
  - Some Districts increasing (e.g, Lebanon, NH going to 5d. IP instruction "good news for the region."
- Threshold for opening Canadian border? "Likely will be shared agreement U.S. & Canada not sure states will have much say."





# Tuesday Media Briefing (cont'd.)

### VT DFR Commissioner Pieciak:

- □ VT data in good shape *but* . . .
  - "Grim" national/international milestones (1m. Deaths)
  - Very low prevalence in NE (esp. VT) but ND, SD, IA, WI, TN, MS, AL "struggling" w/new hot spots emerging.

### □ VT Data:

- Lowest 2-wk. period for new cases since late May (even w/K-12 & higher ed reopening).
- Metrics all in good shape; VT #4 per capita for testing & # 1 in cases.
- Quebec had been doing well but seeing increases; lessons learned from Maine wedding!





# Tuesday Media Briefing (cont'd.)

### Commissioner Levine:

Intl. milestone 1m. deaths (US 4% world pop but 20% of d.

# **Testing:**

- PH Lab has done almost 280K tests for nearly 162K individuals.
- White House sending Abbott BinaxNOW card (Ag) tests: 12K to VT now and 180K by year-end.
  - "Tests will have a role in VT" will release alert to clinical community by week's end
  - Federal prioritization for potential surge areas & vulnerable populations; e.g. compliance with new CMS guidance re: testing & visitation in LTC.





# Tuesday Media Briefing (cont'd.)

### Commissioner Levine:

- Educational re-openings going well: colleges & universities
   "plateauing & beginning to consider discussions re: next semester."
- K-12: one recent (St. J) case positive by Ag test; awaiting PCR.
  - Test result was considered positive by school & VDH contact tracing, appropriate decisions made re: classes.
  - Our model in VT : VDH works closely w/supts., principals, SNs respond swiftly & treat each case individually to take correct actions/contain spread.
- □ Reminder re: influenza vaccine
- If you were among crowds at beach/large BBQ, consider getting tested to reduce risk to others around you.
