## Our Programs

Private infant adoption; **Project Family** (a collaboration with DCF) to find forever families for children/teenagers in state's custody; post finalization support for adoptive families; option counseling for pregnant individuals; search and reunion services for adult adoptees and birth families.

#### **Treatment**

**Community Based Substance Use and Mental Health Disorder Treatment** Outpatient substance use and mental health disorder treatment program for parents; spoke in the state's Care Alliance for Opioid Addiction.

**Regional Partnership Program** (RPP) Partnership with the Department of Children and Families to promote timely access for parents to substance use disorder screening, referrals and connection to treatment.

**Residential Program** Vermont's only facility where pregnant or parenting women can live with their children while engaging in treatment for mental health and substance use disorders; family-centered clinical treatment, with integrated case management, parenting education, and developmental screening and assessment for children.

#### **Education**

**Lund's Early Childhood Education Program** (LECP) 5 STAR early childhood education program providing therapeutic, play based early care and education to 50 children aged two weeks to five years.

**New Horizons Education Program** (NHEP) Fully licensed high school completion program for pregnant or parenting young women.

**Teen Pregnancy Prevention Outreach Program** Panelists from Lund share their stories and insight into the reality of life as a young mother at schools and community organizations; education sessions on birth control methods and sexual health.

#### **Family Support**

**Family Education** Parenting education and support in homes and onsite at Lund including developmental screening and assessment for children.

**Kids-A-Part** (KAP) Facilitating contact between incarcerated moms and their children; enhancing parenting capacity of moms; supporting caregivers in the community; education and advocacy to meet the needs of children of incarcerated parents.

**Independence Place** (IP) Transitional housing for seven pregnant or parenting women and their children; as needed parent coaching and independent living skills instruction.

**Reach Up** Reach Up case management for parents in Chittenden County helping families to address barriers to self-sufficiency.

**Vermont Family Recovery Project** Intensive home based services for at-risk families in Burlington and Newport; increasing permanency and wellbeing for children when parental substance use disorder places them at risk for out-of-home placement. Lund's Early Childhood Education Program served **71 children** last year. **98%** of them made progress in their social and emotional development.

**143 mothers** and **69 fathers** engaged in outpatient Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services.

### Kids-A-Part helped **218 incarcerated mothers** continue to build the bond with their **381 children.**

**1139 parents** were referred to the **Regional Partnership Program. 80%** of those at risk of substance use disorder engaged in treatment, increasing safety and permanence for their children.

### **314 children** found their forever families through adoptions facilitated by **Project Family.**

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**43 families** obtained employment and moved off **Reach Up,** helping to break multigenerational cycles of poverty.

**74 women** engaged in treatment for substance use and/or mental health disorders at Lund's **Residential Program** while living with their **70 children**, maintaining the mother child bond.

#### **100% of women** who completed **Independence Place** left with permanent, affordable housing.

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These partnerships are vital to our successful outcomes.

**92% of parents** surveyed reported that Lund's **Parent Child Center services** helped them feel strong and confident as a parent.

Lund provided **Post Permanency Services** to **190 individuals** to ensure that adoptive families are healthy and well connected to needed resources.

Last year **5,407 individuals** benefited from Lund's programs and services.
