## ermont Geriatrics Conference

The ninth annual Vermont Area Health Education Centers (AHEC) Geriatrics Conference will be a one-day symposium covering practical and provocative issues in the medical care of older adults. Physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists, and other health professionals with an interest in the care of older adults are encouraged to attend. This year's agenda focuses on medical issues that are commonly addressed in routine primary care practice, including geriatric renal conditions, depression and anxiety in the elderly, and diastolic heart failure. Effective communication skills when using the electronic medical record, substance use disorders in late life, and oral health will also be discussed in the afternoon concurrent sessions. In addition, practical applications of Act 39 will be presented, and an update on the rollout and current status of the Support and Services at Home (SASH) program will be discussed. The conference will end with a discussion of the Accountable Care Organization that has been formed by Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center and Fletcher Allen Health Care. Participants will have the opportunity to choose two of three concurrent sessions. Ample time for discussion and questions has been built into the schedule.

Vermont AHEC improves access to quality healthcare through its focus on workforce development; it is a partnership between the Northeastern Vermont AHEC, Champlain Valley AHEC, Southern Vermont AHEC, and the University of Vermont College of Medicine AHEC Program. AHEC believes that success in healthcare innovation, transformation, and reform depends upon an adequate supply and distribution of well-trained healthcare professionals.
