Ms. Bulle feels it is important for these women to share their stories and for Vermonters to have a better understanding of their life experiences, past, present, and future.

Over 200 people participated in the International Women's Day Burlington event and heard the riveting stories of community members' journeys to America. Guest speakers were women from many countries in the world including: Africa, Europe, India, Asia, Nepal, and the Arab world.

One critical message to be taken away is to end violence against women and that women should be treated with respect. Men who support women were also appreciated and mention was made to be mindful to raise men who are not threatened by women's success. This event was intended to help raise the status of women, and was indeed a celebration of women and all that they contribute to their families and society.
