

Call for Nominations for Prestigious Damon Runyon Clinical Investigator Award for Cancer Research

The University of Vermont has been invited to send five candidate nominations to the Damon Runyon Foundation for its Clinical Investigator Award. The award, as stated by the Foundation "... supports the most promising early career physician-scientists willing to devote their efforts to the development and application of new diagnostic approaches and therapeutic strategies for cancer and cancer prevention through clinical investigation." The award provides \$450,000 over three years in addition to retiring up to \$100,000 of medical school debt.

The unique partnership between the Damon Runyon Foundation and the National Cancer Institute (NCI) gives MD and MD/PhD degree holders who are early in their careers opportunities to work closely with the NCI and access to the expertise and resources at the NIH Clinical Center to build collaborative, translational research.

Nomination letters are due to <u>Kate Webster</u>, UVM Cancer Center Administrative Director, by **noon on Wednesday**, **December 5th**. Self-nominations are acceptable.
