

Course Description

This event will discuss a variety of timely, practical issues that are encountered in the emergency department on a daily basis. Lectures will be engaging, sometimes controversial, and present the audience with examples of both successes and failures in emergency medicine. Changes don't always equal advances and advancement doesn't always mean change. At the end of this program, participants should be able to distinguish between advancement and change in the emergency department in a relaxed, family-oriented environment where learning does equal fun!

This program has been designed to include all emergency medicine professionals including physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, trauma nurses, residents, and emergency medicine technicians.

 Review the use of clinical ultrasound in managing the ED patient presenting
- Consider the use of dialysis in cases of poisoned patients.
 Assess the new directions in hypothermia resuscitation.
 Be more adept in ED diagnosis and stabilization of cardiac arrhythmias.

Workshop Information

The Clinical Ultrasound Workshop is a full-day, intensive course designed for novice and more advanced clinicians that cover primary ultrasound applications. The workshop will expose participants to the latest ultrasound equipment and uses live models for a realistic training experience. Enrollment will be limited to ensure only 2 – 3 participants per ultrasound system and instructor.

Basic: Includes FAST, AAA, ECHO, vascular access station, and basic lung

Advanced: Includes DVT, gall bladder, ECHO, and regional anesthesia

Airway Workshop: Will focus on comprehensive management of the adult and pediatric airway in the emergency department setting. Although basic principles and instrumentation will be reviewed, this skill-intensive course is designed for experienced airway providers. Using simulators, porcine tissue models, and a wide range of equipment, participants will have the opportunity to practice basic and advanced intubation and rescue airway techniques. In addition, there will be a heavy focus on the development of a systematic approach to rapid sequence intubation to attenuate physiologic decline and improve safety throughout the procedure (4 hours).

Registration and Cancellation

TUITION: \$525 Physicians; \$375 Nurses, Physician Assistants, and other Emergency Medicine professionals; \$275 for Residents.
