Alleviate food insecurity and malnutrition by providing benefits to help Vermonters purchase food wherever they shop and meals for children where they learn and play.





SNAP Kept Millions Out of Poverty and "Deep Poverty" – Below Half the Poverty Line – in 2012

CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAMS: LEGISLATION & FUNDING

Our Goal: No CNR / No major changes

What to watch out for:

- Increased eligibility threshold for Community Eligibility Provision
- Major changes to nutrition requirements
- Cuts to complimentary programs (i.e. 21st Century Programs)



FEDERAL PROGRAMS AT THE STATE & LOCAL LEVEL

Communities can support a culture of food access & good nutrition

State:

- Maintain access & state's financial support for programs
- Retain staffing levels

Local

School budgets: "investment" vs. "debt"



SUPPORT PATIENTS' FOOD ACCESS
