

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will provide practical approaches to common problems in Hospital Medicine informed by experts and the latest evidence.

TARGET AUDIENCE

The target audience is comprised of physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and nurses practicing Hospital Medicine. Some of the clinicians will also be engaged in education, research, quality improvement, and management. The audience may also include Hospital Medicine program administrators, resident physicians, and medical students with an interest in careers in Hospital Medicine

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

By the end of the event, participants should be able to:

- Identify updates in Hospital and Consultative Medicine
- Recognize the role of inpatient palliative care
- Use new oral diabetes medications

WORKSHOP INFORMATION

A. **Point of Care Ultrasound Workshop** *(SimLab on the UVM Campus-Sunday, February 10, 7:30am-12:00pm) Point-of-care ultrasound has emerged as an important bedside tool in the management of acutely ill patients. This workshop combines high-yield didactic sessions with hands-on training on live models. The workshop starts with a review of ultrasound technology basics and then explores a myriad of diagnostic ultrasound applications: focused cardiac ultrasound, pleural effusions, pneumothorax, ascites and lower extremity deep venous thrombosis. The workshop is ideal for both beginners and those looking to refine their ultrasound skills. Expected faculty to attendee ratio is 1:3.

*Please note that this workshop will occur at the UVM Campus in Burlington, VT, approximately 45 minutes by car from the Lodge at Spruce Peak.

B. **Physical Exam Skills Workshop** (The Lodge at Spruce Peak - Monday, February 10, 2-4:00pm): The bedside physical examination is an essential component of excellent patient care. Physical examination findings add diagnostic data that enhance clinical reasoning at the bedside and help providers select high value studies. In addition, the physical exam itself can help foster trust between clinicians and patients. This workshop will help providers refresh their physical examination skill set, understand the evidence behind various physical exam findings, and effectively collaborate with patients despite the challenges posed by the fast pace of inpatient medical care. The course will include case-based and hands-on learning that will demonstrate how the physical examination improves care delivery and is the foundation of the provider-patient relationship.

C. **Patient Centered Communication in the Hospital Workshop** (Lodge at Spruce Peak - Monday, February 10, 1-4:00pm): Looking to avoid burnout? Enhance workday satisfaction? Head home each night knowing you have made critical connections with your patients? Join us for this engaging and highly interactive workshop focused on what really matters: caring for patients and taking care of yourself at the same time. Participate in simulations of real clinical scenarios and learn new ways to approach patients and their families to meet your goals. *limited space due to the hands-on interactive nature of the workshop.

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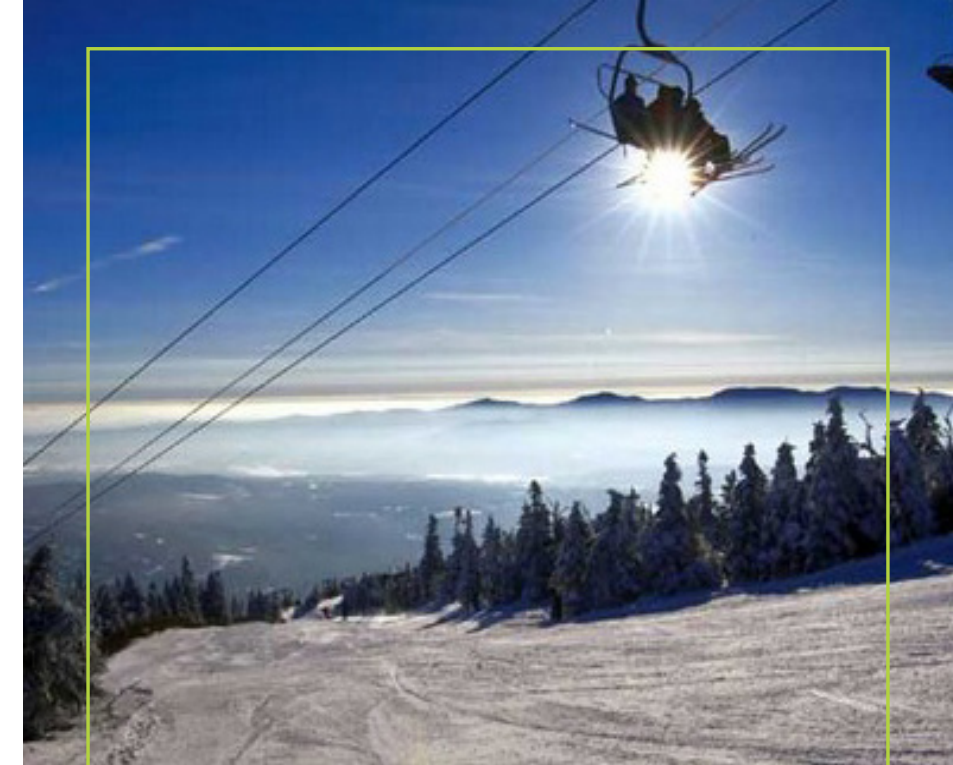

ACCOMMODATIONS

A block of rooms has been reserved at the Lodge at Spruce Peak in Stowe, Vermont.
