I -Income	Do you have any concerns about making ends meet?
-Insurance	Do you have any concerns about your child's health insurance?
H -Hunger -Housing Conditions -Homeless	Do you have any concerns about having enough food? • Have you ever been worried whether your food would run out before you got money to buy more? • Within the past year has the food you bought ever not lasted and you didn't have money to get more?
	Do you have any concerns about poor housing conditions like mice, mold, cockroaches?
	Do you have any concerns about being evicted or not being able to pay the rent?
	Do you have any concerns about not being able to pay your mortgage?
E -Education/Special Ed -Ensuring Safety (Violence)	Do you have any concerns about your child's educational needs?
	[DO NOT ASK IN FRONT OF CHILD 3 OR OLDER OR IN FRONT OF OTHER PARTNER] "From speaking to families, I have learned that violence in the home is common and now I ask all families about violence in the home. Do you have any concerns about violence in your home?"
L -Legal Status (Immigration)	What hospital was your child born in?
	● If not in U.S.: "Are you aware that your child may be eligible for benefits even though they were not born in the U.S.? If you would like, I can have a social worker come talk to you about some possible benefits your child may be eligible. Would you like me to do that?"
P -Power of Attorney -Guardianship	Are you the biological mother or father of this child?
	● [If not] "Can you show me the power of attorney or guardianship document you have?"
