Curriculum

PGY 2: 9 months of clinic*, 1 month of Mohs, 1 month dermpath/clinic, 1 month of peds derm

PGY 3: 6 months of clinic*, 2 months of Mohs, 1 month dermpath/clinic, 1 month dermpath, 1 month of elective, 1 month of peds derm

PGY 4: 5 months of clinic*, 2 months of Mohs, 2 months of dermatopathology, 1 month dermpath/clinic, 1 month elective, 1 month of peds derm

*Some pediatric clinics scattered in these months



Typical Week Breakdown

- 6 half day clinics with attendings
- 1 half day resident clinic
- 1 half day reading
- 2 half day academic lectures

On the last Wednesday of each month, residents volunteer at the Community Health Center



Call/Inpatient Consults

Split evenly among first and second years.

Holidays covered by first years.

Average 1-2 inpatient consults/day.

Call is set up in 1 week blocks.
