

LGBT Leadership Scholarships

Women in Medicine (WIM) will present four \$5,000 Leadership Scholarships for LGBT female medical students enrolled in allopathic or osteopathic medical schools in the United States or Canada this year. The application and guidelines are located on the WIM website, WomenInMedicine.org, and is due April 15, 2016. The scholarships will be presented at the WIM annual meeting in Bloomingdale, IL, with the expectation that the medical students will be present to receive their awards. Applicants should be in good academic standing, and have actively contributed/demonstrated leadership for the LGBT community.

Conference Scholarships

Medical students are encouraged to attend WIM for many reasons. Not only is the medical education relevant, but the network of personal and professional support at WIM is also an invaluable investment in a student's education, career and personal growth. WIM invites medical students to apply for scholarships to help defray the cost of attending this conference. The deadline for conference support is June 15, 2016.

Area Information & Leisure Time

Largest city in Illinois; located on Lake Michigan. Chicago is known for its thriving arts scene, various shopping districts and a cornucopia of eateries. First-time Windy City visitors are sure to have their eyes to the sky for at least a day or two. Chicago's skyscrapers and public art is absolutely worth admiring; Tag along on a Chicago Architecture Tour or pass a few hours in Millennium Park and you'll find yourself spending lots of time looking upward. For a different perspective, head up to Willis Tower's Skydeck or 360 CHICAGO for the bird's-eye view before diving headfirst into all the city has to offer — from exceptional museums to pizza that takes delicious to whole new depths.

Chicago White Sox – Come cheer on the White Sox as they play the Baltimore Orioles at Cellular Field on Friday. The ball park features an exploding scoreboard, an old-time facade complete with arches and over 40,000 unobstructed-view seats. This is also a fireworks night!!

Museum Campus – A 57-acre park in Chicago that sits alongside Lake Michigan and encompasses five of the city's most notable attractions: the Adler Planetarium; The Shedd Aquarium; the Field Museum of Natural History; Soldier Field, home of the NFL Chicago Bears football team; and the Lakeside Center of McCormick Place.

Millennium Park - 25 acres of awe-inspiring landscape, breathtaking architecture and an iconic collection of public art, Millennium Park is Chicago's premier green space. All year round, "The Bean" is an iconic draw for visitors and locals alike. Take a picture in front of Cloud Gate, the official name for the massive, stainless steel structure that's become Chicago's signature landmark. In its mirror-like surface you'll see not only your own reflection but the downtown skyline.



Navy Pier – A not-for-profit originally opened as a shipping and recreational facility in 1916. Located on Lake Michigan, it has served many purposes throughout its rich history and currently encompasses more than fifty acres of parks, gardens, shops, restaurants, family attractions and exhibition facilities and is the top leisure destination in the Midwest, drawing nearly nine million visitors annually.

A Women's Health Symposium

Women in Medicine 2016 marks the 33rd annual retreat and CME conference for lesbian and other sexual minority female physicians, medical students and their partners. The yearly conference is a forum for discussion of front-line research on women's health issues, as well as lesbian, bisexual, gender-queer and transgender women's issues. There also are non-medical seminars of interest to all, as well as rejuvenating social opportunities for children and adults alike. Essential networking and mentoring opportunities abound, with a special focus on the needs of medical students and residents. This is the only medical conference where partners are not only invited to attend, but are also welcomed and encouraged to participate and learn from the high quality medical and non-CME presentations. We are proud to present a broad range of medical, ethical and social issues relevant to today's world.

In keeping with the retreat format, only registered physicians and their registered partners are invited to attend the conference. Children are invited to social functions as deemed appropriate.

Course Description

This event is historically geared toward lesbian and other sexual minority female physicians and their partners. It highlights women's health, including lesbian health. However, topics vary across a broad range of medical specialties, and are appropriate for both generalists and specialists. Speakers include nationally and internationally known experts in their fields.

Educational Objectives

- By the end of the event, participants should be able to:
1. Recognize the current state of medical education in relation to the treatment of LGBT patients and identify opportunities to improve it, thereby decreasing health care disparities.
 2. Recognize the epidemic of lesbian obesity and how to intervene.
 3. Review the current updates for the prevention and treatment of osteoarthritis.

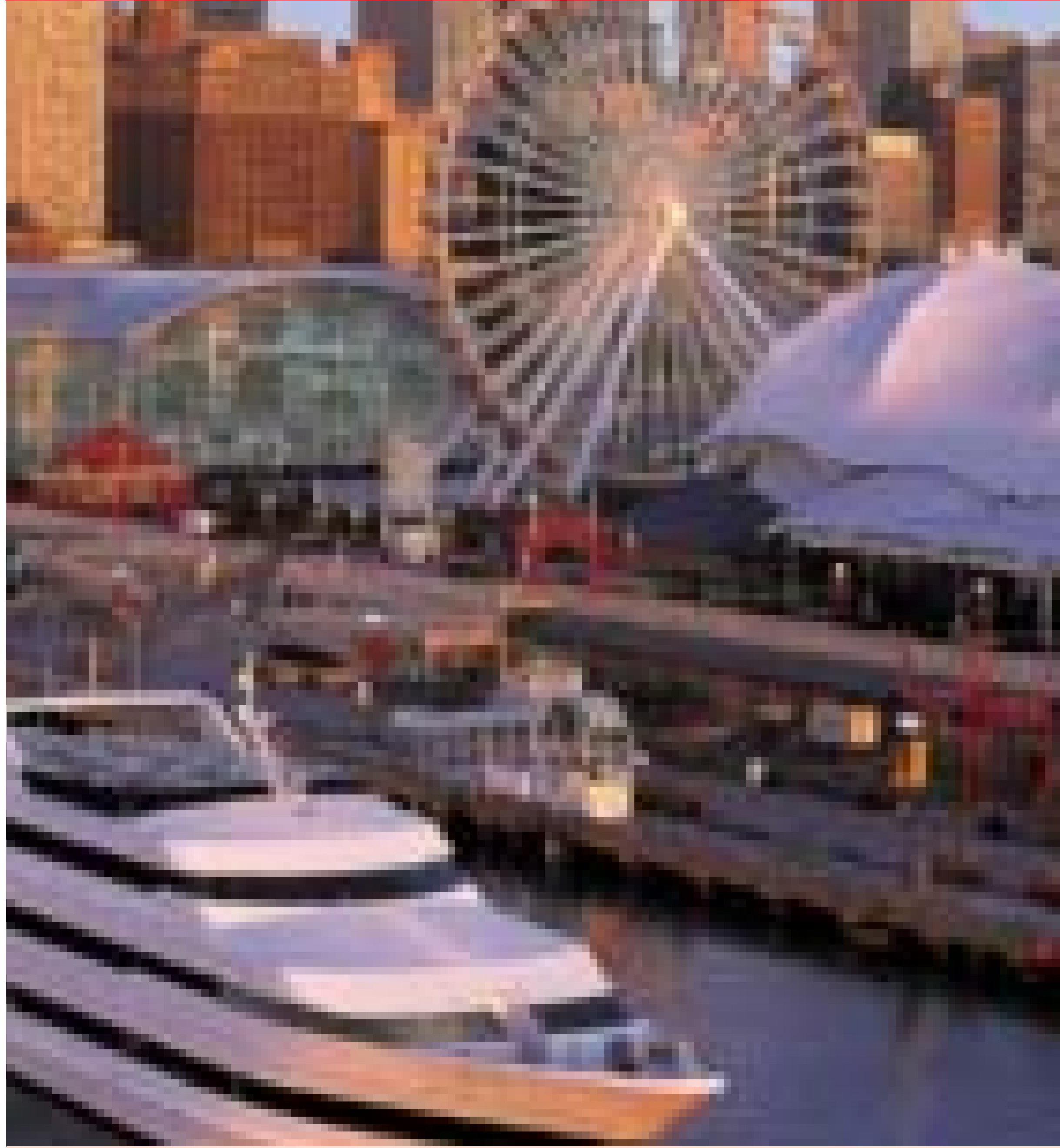
